

From the Pastor

It is now history! The Eucharistic Congress for the Diocese of Springfield is now in the history books. For those, who went to the BOS Center in Springfield last Saturday, on October 28, 2023, they experienced a major aspect of the life story of our diocese.

On June 28, 2003 the Diocesan Jubilee Day was celebrated at the State Fair Grounds in Springfield with approximately 15,000 people in attendance – according to our Catholic Times magazine of October 15, 2023, page 17. It was an outdoor Mass, and some of you probably remember it. At that time I was assigned to Naval Air Station Sigonella in Sicily.

Our Eucharistic Day was celebrated with an attendance of approximately 5,000 people. (The Center would never hold 15,000!) It's a good thing it was inside because it was raining pretty hard when we came out afterwards. We had inspired speakers, an excellent choir with the members coming from parishes in the diocese, and a procession of priests that seemed to have no end. I suspect that anyone, who attended the celebration, has no regrets about coming to it. If history is the norm, then our next big diocesan celebration is in the year 2043.

Next Sunday, November 12th at 2:00, we will gather in the cemetery for Our Prayer of Remembrance Cemetery Service. Years ago we used to gather in church for prayer, and then we would march out to the cemetery, praying the rosary as we processed. I had the idea to try something similar this year but with a procession of golf carts from the church to the cemetery.

Last Sunday evening we had our Remembrance Mass, praying in a special way for those who have died in the past year. We thank Fr. Dennis for presiding and Barb Runde for organizing the event. And we express our gratitude to Sharon Brummer for her work in having the information on the deceased - with their photo – on easels in the sanctuary.






