

From the Pastor

The parishioners of St. Francis extend our condolences to the family of Robert "Bob" Thoele, whose funeral Mass was this Thursday at St. Francis. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord.

We are grateful to Fr. Luke Spannagel, who gave us a parish mission last Wednesday and Thursday evenings. He is the son of our parishioners: John and Donna Spannagel. He spoke to us of the Eucharist, and on Wednesday during Mass he explained what was happening at different points during the Mass. On Thursday morning he spoke to our grade school students.

Baseball, softball, tennis, soccer and other sports can accuse me of prejudice when I highlight our basketball team. How many state championships have our baseball teams won over the years? Without studying the issue, my bet is that more of our students have gone to college with baseball money rather than basketball scholarships. Basketball has a way of bringing more of the community together than the other sports do. I've mentioned to a couple people how when we returned from the game at Newton, there was a steady stream of lights along HWY 33. A person in a car eastbound could have wondered what is going on! It's impressive being a part of something larger than ourselves. Years ago I think the people from the area, who were going to march in D.C. for the Right to Life, would board one of 5 buses that were heading to our nation's capital. And when the highway curved, you could look out your window and see the buses in front of you – all traveling together.

On the radio Monday night the sportscaster commented on the fact that the Wooden Shoes have played in 9 super sectional contests in the past 13 years! That kind of thing doesn't just happen. We produce teams (in all the sports) that we can rightfully be proud of. We have played against a couple teams that were less than good sportsmen. And it is sad to experience that kind of thing. We can be proud of the young men and women, who represent us: the players, the coaches, the managers, etc. A good reputation like this is earned over many years, and it is something for us to continue long into the future. If we ever lose that "ethic" of good sportsmanship, then we have buried the wooden shoes.



PRAY FOR OUR LEADERS

Lenten Regulations

- 1. ABSTINENCE—Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST—Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
- 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
