From the Pastor

Today we celebrate the first Sunday of Advent so Christmas is quickly approaching. Advent has a different spirituality about it than does the season of Lent. Even though the priest wears the same color of vestments during the two seasons, purple or violet, and each season has a Sunday in the middle when rose colored vestments can be worn, Advent has more of a spirit of joy and anticipation about it than does Lent. There is a somber and penitential sense with Lent.

Next Sunday is the second Sunday of Advent, but it falls on December 8th, the feast of the Immaculate Conception! One source tells us that even though the feast of the Immaculate Conception is moved to the next day, the 9th, the obligation to attend Mass does not move with it. However, that is only one source. I wrote the diocese about the question, and the answer I received back is: the obligation to attend Mass moves to Monday the 9th. Maybe in a different diocese a bishop grants a dispensation for the obligation, but here we will have our regular schedule of Masses that we have on a holy day: 6:00 a.m.; 7:55; 12:10 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Adoration will start at the usual time, 1:00 p.m., on Monday, and then there will be a break for the celebration of the Eucharist. Adoration will continue immediately after Mass and conclude at the usual time 6:00 a.m. Tuesday, in time for the 6:30 Mass.

We are in the middle of our Giving Tree project. This is an excellent example of stewardship. People shop for presents for people they have never met; and people receive gifts from people they don't know! The givers are happy to serve and share, and the people receiving gifts are filled with joy! The ornaments (and information for the presents) are on the trees near the doors of the church. The wrapped presents need to be returned to church by December 15, 2024.
