

#### From the Pastor

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. On Monday we start the Ordinary Time of the year with the first week in Ordinary Time. I don't know about you, but I would like to keep the Christmas decorations in church until Ash Wednesday! One of the ladies on our decorating committee told me she received many compliments from the parishioners about our decorations, and rightfully so. The members of the art and decoration committee do an excellent job creating a dignified and attractive atmosphere for us to come together and praise God. We are all grateful to them for their gift to the Lord and to us! They work hard, and they work fast! Our church will still be beautiful, but it's going to be somewhat simple after all the decorations are gone. What remains is in our hearts and souls. God touches us in many ways, being in awe of our church is one significant way the Lord comes to us.

As we celebrate the feast of our Lord's baptism, may it be a reminder of our own baptism. I mentioned our beautiful church, and another way of using the word "church" is to describe us. Through our baptism we enter into the union with Jesus in terms of his death and resurrection. In baptism we die to sin and rise out of the waters into a new life. We are washed clean of all sin. For a baby being baptized, it's only original sin that is washed away, but for an adult it's original sin AND any sin the person ever committed is washed away! Baptism is one of the three sacraments of initiation. The other two are Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. When a person has received all three, the person is fully initiated into the life of the Catholic Church.

Please mark your calendar: next Sunday, the 19<sup>th</sup>, is our Pro Life Breakfast serving from 7:00 a.m. to noon. This occasion has quite a history, and I recall Sunday mornings with a lot of snow on the ground, but it didn't stop the people from working or from coming to the breakfast. It takes a good number of people, and they do respond. Come and do your part, even if it is only being a patron.

If you see Ron Ruholl around, tell him thank you for the great job he did with the snow removal last weekend. He spent a lot of time keeping the sidewalks, drive and parking lot cleaned off for our parishioners.


