LENT BEGINS MARCH 5TH Lenten Regulations

- 1. ABSTINENCE—Everyone <u>14</u> years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST—Everyone <u>18</u> years of age and under <u>60</u> is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
 - . To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

From the Pastor

We have white smoke! Our parish council election last weekend went smoothly, and I am happy to share with you the results. The top three people are Lisa Siemer, Gabe Rauch and Johnny Meinhart. Congratulations! I thank all, who were willing to put their name on the ballot. In the near future, the three parishioners, who have served on the council for the last three years will be moving on, and they are: Shannon Hinkle, Rhonda Meyer and Dennis Runde. We are grateful for their service to the parish and the community. As many have said, they are glad they served because they have a much better idea of what goes into the workings of the parish. I find it interesting that Canon Law requires that each parish have a Finance Council. A Parish Council is not required!

Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday! We have 4 Masses: 6:00 a.m., 8:00 a.m., 12:10 p.m. and the last one at 7:00 p.m. I hope that everyone can attend Mass during those 13 hours! Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation, but many people participate in the Eucharist to begin their season of Lent. Our weekday Masses all Lent see an increase of people coming to pray.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstaining. If you are over 18 years of age and under 60, then you have to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means not eating between meals, and only one large meal. Abstaining means not eating meat. If you are 14 years of age, then you have to abstain on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Every Friday during Lent we have the Way of the Cross, also called "Stations." This happens at 7:00 p.m. If you have never prayed the Way of the Cross, come on Friday evening and pray.

Start NOW to prepare how you will pray through Lent. I suggest doing something positive, and hopefully you will benefit from the penance. The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. A good plan will incorporate all three pillars.




OPEN HOUSE & Lenten Series – SonRise Men's Breakfast
