

## seder meal

At the Last Supper Jesus celebrated the Seder Meal/Passover Meal. This Jewish meal remembers the ancient Israelites escape from slavery under the Egyptians. The Israelites were

instructed by Moses to sacrifice an unblemished lamb for their meal. The blood of the lamb was to be spread on their door posts so the angel of death would **Passover** their homes. After the meal the Israelites were ready to cross the Red Sea to freedom.

It was at the Last Supper, Passover/Seder meal, that Jesus instituted the Eucharist. In this year of the Eucharistic Revival please join us on Sunday, April 2 at 4:00PM in the School Dining Room to celebrate and remember the Jewish Seder Meal. Fr. Tom will be the facilitator and there is no charge for the meal.

# St. Joseph's Table

St. Joseph's Feast Day is observed on March 19. Since St. Joseph was the foster father of Jesus. his life is



considered to be an example of what a father figure should look and be like and because of this, many cultures celebrate Father's Day by honoring St. Joseph and fathers together.

St. Joseph is the patron saint of workers and in 1870 Pope Pius IX declared Joseph to be the patron and protector of the Catholic Church.


The tradition of the St. Joseph's table began centuries ago by the Sicilians after suffering a severe drought. Their people were starving, and having nothing to rely on except their faith, they prayed to St. Joseph, their Patron Saint, to intercede on their behalf.

When their prayers were answered they held a celebration of thanksgiving to St. Joseph and invited all the orphans, widows and homeless to dine with them. They vowed to continue this tradition annually and thus began the beginning of St. Joseph's table and helping to feed the poor.

We invite you to help carry on this tradition by bringing non-perishable food items to church from March 18-26 and place them on or near our table located in front of St. Joseph's Altar. All donations will be given to the Full Shelf Food Pantry in West Bend. An Alms box is available if you wish to make a monetary donation. If you wish to write a check please make it out to the *Full Shelf Food Pantry*.

## ST. PATRICK'S DAY DISPENSATION

After careful consideration, Archbishop Jerome E. Listecki has granted a dispensation for March 17, 2023 which lifts the obligation of abstinence from meat on Fridays during Lent so Catholics in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee can celebrate St. Patrick's Day.

"A feast day in the Church means what it says – it calls for celebratory feasting," Archbishop Listecki said. "However, Catholics who partake in the St. Patrick's Day feast are encouraged to engage in another sacrificial or charitable act that day or give up meat on another day."

## Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

## Why do we do that?

### **Catholic Life Explained**

#### **Easter**

#### Question:

Why does the date of Easter change every year, while most other celebrations are celebrated on the same day?

#### **Answer:**

Every feast is celebrated at a certain time for a reason. Saints feast days are commonly the day of their death. While we don't know Jesus' exact birthday, we celebrate the "light of the world" around the time of winter solstice, as dark, wintery days begin to lengthen again. We have a historical clue, however, to when the Easter events occurred. We know that Jesus was crucified the day before Passover. The Jews calculated the date for Passover based on both the solar and lunar calendars. It corresponds to the first full moon after the spring equinox. The early Christians maintained this connection in their celebrations of Easter on the first Sunday after the paschal full moon.

We don't re-calculate the full moon every year. As astronomy developed, so too did the forecasts of when Easter would occur in future years. The Church has created a table of calculated dates, projecting the date of Easter decades in advance. The date of Easter also determines the date of Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent, as well as the feast days following in the Easter season, including Pentecost. So these feasts move, too! This tradition may seem complicated, but it connects our Christian faith now to what has come before — our Jewish roots and the real, historical reality of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection.
