

A Return to Communion under Both Forms: Consecrated Host and Consecrated Cup

We are happy to announce that Archbishop Listecki has given permission for parishes to once again distribute communion under both forms: the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ. It has been three years now, since the beginning of the Covid pandemic, that we have received communion under only one form, the consecrated host. It is important to remember, however, that the Catholic Church teaches that Christ is present fully - Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity - in **each** form of Holy Communion. "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite. But "the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharist meal appears more clearly." This is the usual form of receiving communion in the Eastern rites. (See 1390 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church). Because of this more complete sign, many folks have longed to return to receiving communion under both forms. This permission from the Archbishop is received with great joy.

Beginning on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023 at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we here at Holy Trinity will return to communion under both forms. In doing so, a few reminders are important for all of us. No one is obligated to receive from the consecrated cup. If someone is not feeling well, or has a compromised physical immune system, they should refrain from receiving the Precious Blood. Intinction (partially dipping the consecrated host into the consecrated cup) is not permitted. And a firm and bold "Amen" is the response of the communicant to the words, "The Blood of Christ."

This return to our usual practice also means that at our Masses we will once again need Eucharistic ministers to assist with communion. It would helpful if all past Eucharistic ministers could call the parish office to let us know of your continuing availability to assist at weekend Masses. In addition, if there are those who would like to become Eucharistic ministers, please let the parish office know so that we can give you the proper training for this ministry. We certainly can use your help in this important ministry. Thank you.

Come to the Eucharistic Feast of Christ's Body and Blood!

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.
