

Dear Parishioners and School Families, and Friends:

Happy New Year! The Faculty and Staff wish you many blessings and good health throughout 2022. We pray for good health and safety for everyone. St. Patrick School will continue to follow the precautions and guidelines from the IDPH, and TCHD concerning COVID-19 in hopes to keep illness to a minimum at our school.

Believe it or not, it is time to begin planning for the 2022-2023 school year! One important thing is the tuition assistance that qualifying families may receive through the Illinois Invest in Kids Act scholarship program. It is important to reserve your place in line as soon as possible. Last year nearly *\$25,000* was donated to program by generous donors that helped thirteen students at St. Patrick School receive full or partial scholarships. This was seven more students receiving scholarships than 2020-2021 school year.

Tax Credit Scholarships for 2022-2023

Are you interested in attending St. Patrick School and need help with tuition? Then please apply to Empower Illinois for a scholarship. Below is information to begin the process.

Reservations for a 2022-2023 tax credit scholarship will open:

Wednesday, January 12 at 6:30pm.

Go to: https://empowerillinois.org/ and click on "Apply".

Like previous years, the reservation will be a two-step process. At 6:30pm, the reservation form will open, giving families time to enter their information before submission at 7pm. Once families reserve their time stamp, they will receive an email to log into their EmpowerXChange portal and complete the application.

These tax-credits, income-needs based scholarships offer up to 100% of K-8 tuition provided through the generous support of donors who receive a 75% credit on their Illinois income tax. The scholarships are a result of the IL Invest in Kids Act, which is in its fifth year of implementation. **Thank you to our wonderful donors** for this incredible effort to assist families in providing opportunities to attend our Catholic schools! 



Saint of the Week

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.
