

The following is the press release shared by The **Tazewell County Right for Life:**

49th Year for Baby Food Delivery was held on January 21, 2022.

Tazewell County Right to Life, with the help of the seventh grade students from St. Patrick School, Washington, will deliver over \$4500 worth of baby food and formula on January 21, 2022 to area social service agencies.

This will mark the 49th year for the Tazewell County Right to Life project.

The event begins with a 9:00 A.M. appointment with US Rep. Darin LaHood at the Congressman's office, 100 NE Monroe, Peoria. The virtual meeting/video chat will be an opportunity to thank Congressman LaHood for his pro-life votes and to ask him to continue supporting pro-life legislation. He will also answer questions from the students.

"This baby food is donated in memory of the more than 62 million babies who have been killed by abortion since the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision," stated Kay Grillot, project coordinator and President of Tazewell County Right to Life. "We are hopeful for a Supreme Court ruling this summer that will reverse Roe v Wade and restore protection for pre-born babies."

Grillot continued, "The people of Central Illinois are very generous and recognize that all the money collected is used for baby food and formula to help families who have chosen life for their babies."

Most of the baby food and formula was purchased with donations from area churches, the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians, and 2 Councils of the Knights of Columbus.

However, of the total, the St. Patrick School students collected \$1900 worth of the food, formula, cereal, and juice from their schoolmates at St. Patrick School in Washington.

The seventh grade class at St. Patrick School has been participating in the project since 2001. For the students, it is a multi-subject project; combining religion, social studies and math. Serving the community is part of the Catholic faith, visiting Congressman LaHood's office is a lesson in civics, and figuring the value of the baby food and formula is a math exercise.

The baby items will be taken to Catholic Charities St. Gianna Baby Pantry, the Empower Life Center, the Women's Care Center, and Crittenton Crisis Nursery, all in Peoria. Mrs. Christine Kapraun, the seventh grade homeroom teacher, who supervises the project at St. Patrick School, will accompany the students.

February 3 – Thursday - Celebrating Vocations

Tie Dye Thursday – Students may wear tie dyed clothing. A Novena to St. Patrick will be prayed at the beginning of each class period over the intercom. Cards will be created and funds collected for a Care package for Seminarian Nathan Hopper. Spiritual bouquets will be created for Pastor, Parochial Vicar, and Sisters. Virtual Talent Show will be performed from 1:30-3:00 p.m.

February 4 – Friday - Celebrating Teachers and Staff

Fandom Friday – Students may wear Irish Spirit-wear with jeans or athletic pants. All School Mass will be held at 8:15 a.m.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place after the 8:15 a.m. Mass and All School Benediction will be at 3:00 p.m.

Students will have lunch in their classrooms from 11:00-11:40.

Teachers and staff will have lunch together from 11:40-12:45 with classes covered by St. Patrick Ministry Room Parents.


