





GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Do you ever find yourself feeling like you are at the cusp of something remarkable? Like you are witnessing an incredible, historic, athletic, or aeronautical feat? I wonder if that's what it was like for the followers of Jesus when he began his public ministry: "News of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all." In today's Gospel, Jesus reads the words of the prophet Isaiah that are effectively a "job description" of his mission: glad tidings to the poor, liberty of captives, sight to the blind, freedom for the oppressed. What Isaiah prophesied, Jesus claims to fulfill. He thus inaugurates his public ministry with a claim that is straightforward, bold, true, and of great consequence. Today, by virtue of our baptism, we are part of the body of Christ and share in that mission. Whatever our backgrounds, abilities, or talents, we each have something to contribute to building up one another and the Church. And with the help of the Holy Spirit, we, too, can be bold in our own proclamation of Jesus Christ as Lord.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT


We've heard the phrase "Don't sell yourself short." Social media aside, many of us tend to focus on our shortcomings: We may wish we could run faster, be better at our jobs, have a cleaner home, in general, "get it together!" Truth is, we're all works in progress. That's what I love about Paul's Letter to the Corinthians. He reminds us that each one of us – whatever our strengths or weaknesses – is part of the body of Christ. God loves us with our imperfections, not in spite of them. As such, each of us has indispensable value and much to contribute to the mission of the Church. As we move into the week ahead, today's readings invite us to place ourselves at the service of the Church and one another. Beyond that, we can invite others to join us by recognizing that God values the talents – and foibles – that each of us brings to his service.




Grief Care at Blessed Sacrament Church!

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL – 4th QUARTER REPORT

THANK YOU to the parishioners of Blessed Sacrament Church for their support and generous contributions to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. We have been able to assist our friends in need with some requests that have been above and beyond our usual parameters because of the generosity of the parishioners.

SVdP meetings are held on the second Tuesday of the month and anyone interested in this ministry is invited to attend. We enjoy our time together to enrich our spirituality and continue to enhance our special ministry of home visits and special projects. We continue to serve our Friends in Need with a phone call instead of meeting them in person. We want to keep our volunteers and our Friends in Need safe. Our biggest request has been for rent and utility bill assistance. Along with helping in those areas, we also try to give other resources. We also try to provide lists of available jobs in our area.

We thank our donors who make it possible to provide this assistance!

HOME VISIT TEAMS – Our helpline received calls for assistance for **28** households (77 individuals) and \$15,804 was distributed for rent/housing assistance while \$2,039 was allocated for utilities, etc.

COMMUNITY HARVEST PROJECT (Kathy Brandt, Coordinator) – Goods valued at \$1,042 were donated to the Food Pantry.

DISASTER RELIEF – \$1,000 was donated to a disaster relief fund.

ENOUGH STUFF THRIFT SHOP (Sue Rapp, Coordinator) – **\$635** in goods donated.

SOPHIA'S KITCHEN (Kay Schmitz, Coordinator) – \$1,783 was used to purchase products to help stock the shelves for the soup kitchen.

THANKSGIVING GIFT CARDS – Kroger gift cards valued at **\$2,475** were distributed to assist families with groceries at Thanksgiving.

WE CARE (Jean Baile, Coordinator) – Hams and turkeys valued at \$309 were donated to the We Care Food Pantry.

(Diane Matheson, Coordinator) – Our SVdP members continue to serve on the 3rd Saturday of every month. *Volunteers should bring and wear face masks for everyone's safety. 
