# Welcome to Our Lady of Victory Catholic Parish

## A message from Fr. Jake....

Welcome to Laetare Sunday! This special Sunday reminds us that we are now over half way done with our Lenten journey. The liturgical color of Rose reminds us that we are called to see life with the love and joy that the Lord bestows on us. Therefore, we are asked in a special way this Sunday to "rejoice" in our Lord Jesus Christ, which is the meaning of "laetare."

St. Paul gives us an important reminder in the second reading for this weekend: "For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance" (Eph 2:10). I hope that all of us can find some joy in the knowledge that we are God's handiwork, and we have gifts that only we can share with this world. The recent experience of COVID-19 has limited the sharing of our gifts with others, but this reality does not negate the fact that we are truly God's handiwork, special and blessed daughters and sons who are called to share God's love with others. As I have mentioned many times, the greatest ability that has been given to us is the ability to pray, so your prayers have made the difference in so many people's lives through the last year.

In seminary, I came across the following passage from the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults about stewardship, and I believe that it can help us to prayerfully consider how each of us are called to share God's love with each other:

Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be a disciple. Stewardship has the power to shape and mold our understanding of our lives and the way in which we live. Jesus' disciples, as Christian stewards, recognize God as the origin of life, the giver of freedom, and the source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards (p. 451).

If we are to follow Jesus as His disciples, we also must be good stewards of the many gifts that He has put in our lives. The joy and freedom that comes from this knowledge truly gives us the strength and courage to give in intentional and sacrificial ways. The more we give, the more that God gives to us. I have seen this in my life, and I have witnessed this reality in the lives of parishioners. In the end, we do not have to worry about counting the cost as much as trying to be as generous as possible in our lives since we know how generous God is to us. This knowledge can be a tremendous source of consolation in our lives.

This coming week you will be receiving in the mail a letter from me along with a pledge card for our annual Stewardship of Treasure renewal. One of the many ways we share the gifts in our lives is through our financial support of the parish. Therefore, the parish leadership is asking all households to prayerfully discern how they can financially support the church during the coming fiscal year of 2021-2022. I know that many families have been deeply impacted by the events of last year, so please know that any response we get from families in the parish is truly appreciated as we look towards the future. Parishioners' pledges help parish leadership be better stewards of the gifts that you entrust to us because we are then able to better plan for the future.

You can return your pledge envelope by putting it in the offertory box in church or mailing it back to the parish office. We would like these back before Easter if at all possible. This way we can give a report back to the parish in April and then present our annual parish budget to you in May.

Thank you very much for your continued support of OLV and our mission of sharing the preaching, teaching, and healing of Jesus Christ. Our Lady of Victory, please pray that our parish will be good stewards of the gifts God has given us and share the joy of Jesus with others!

Reminder: No Faith Formation classes this week - Spring Break.

St. Joseph was the strong, silent type. He spoke through his actions. Did you realize there is no record of St. Joseph saying anything during his lifetime? Despite this silence, he is a very important figure in the story of Jesus. As His foster father he gave Him the lineage of David to fulfill the prophecy. He was the Virgin Mary's Most Chaste Spouse; protecting her virginity and saving her from the consequences of being an unwed mother. He left quite a legacy even as a humble, quiet man in the background. Jesus knew St. Joseph would be a great example for chastity, work ethic, honoring Mary, patience, self-control and love of the Lord. Jesus was fully man and fully God. While His Divinity kept Him from running away from the horrible death He had to face, His humanness had to face the fear of pain and suffering. He needed a father figure who would teach him to stick to commitments, to offer up His own wants and to be an example when other men ran away to hide. St. Joseph fulfilled those requirements.

Who is St. Joseph to you? A protector, a role model of fatherhood, an intercessor? As we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph this week, may we follow the example of St. Joseph in living a faithful life and may we turn to him to intercede for our needs.

*"Glorious Patriarch Saint Joseph, whose power makes the impossible possible, come to my aid in these times of anguish and difficulty. Take under your protection the serious and troubling situations that I commend to you, that they may have a happy outcome. My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power." (Prayer to St. Joseph, prayed daily by our Holy Father Pope Francis.)*

## March is Brain injury awareness Month.

Brain Injuries, also known as a traumatic brain injury is a blow or jolt to the head or a penetrating head injury that disrupts the function of the brain. Brain injuries can happen from sports, car accidents, or general accidents. Symptoms of a brain injury can be immediate or delayed. This can include blurry vision, confusion, and difficulty concentrating. If you have an infant, symptoms may include crying persistently or be irritable. There are an estimated 2.8 million people treated for traumatic brain injury in the United States each year. Children from 0-4 years and teenagers from 15-19 years are at the highest risk of brain injuries.

Facts about Brain Injuries:

- Males are twice as likely as females to sustain a traumatic brain injury.
- Using a seatbelt when driving or helmet when playing a sport is the best way to avoid a brain injury.
- A blow to one part of the brain can cause damage throughout the whole brain.
- A concussion is a mild brain injury but can lead to a traumatic brain injury if not treated or monitored properly.

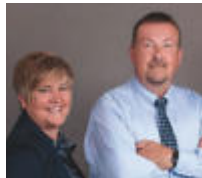
