

# FROM OUR PASTOR

## UPDATE ON PLASTER DAMAGE IN CHURCH

I wanted to give everyone a brief update on the continuing water damage we are seeing in the left hand corner of the church above the sacristy door. We are working with the Archdiocese of Chicago Facilities Office, as well as with contractors and an architect to look at what might be causing the leak.

It's a bit of a process of elimination as we look into all of the possible issues that could be causing the damage. The current thought is that there may be an issue with the chimney that is causing the water damage. We have had people looking at the boiler and chimney connection. And we will be looking into the overall integrity of the chimney stack.

Unfortunately, things are moving slower than I would have liked. But I am confident that we have a good team of people helping us to investigate the problem and we

will be able to get down to the bottom of it. Roger McCarron is the Chair of our Facilities Committee and he has been an enormous help to me in all of these conversations with contractors and the Archdiocese.

I will keep you updated as we learn more. Thankfully, there is still money in the capital campaign fund that we have been using to pay for the investigative work into this problem. Please say a prayer that the fund will have enough money in it to pay for whatever needs fixing!

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

JULY 18, 2021

How many times have you opened up scripture only to be confronted by a passage that you didn't understand or something that was hard to interpret? **Justice and mercy** are both qualities attributed to God, yet how can the two coexist? How can one be just, yet merciful? This very question has confounded the minds of many saints and theologians. In this Sunday's readings, we get a glimpse of this justice/mercy interplay in the divine will of God. "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture... I will take care to punish your evil deeds." Justice. "Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up a righteous shoot to David; as king he shall reign and govern wisely, he shall do what is just and right in the land. In his days Judah shall be saved, Israel shall dwell in security." Mercy. What is even more astounding about this mercy, is that it is God himself who will collect the scattered sheep and bring them back to the sheepfold. This is perhaps the greatest example of affective maturity: the willingness to be wounded by something and to do it anyway, for the good of the other. To clean up something that was not God's doing and is not deserved from us, yet the Lord is abundant in his mercy, and though we abuse and reject him he comes anyway, fully knowing what lies ahead. God's Providence

is astounding in the truest sense of the term. God offers this mercy to you, reading these words. His love is not just a blanket generic love for 'the sheep' in general. He loves you deeply and calls you by name personally. Some of the great mystics of Church tradition have described God's love as 'burning.'

He loves us enough not to leave us in our misery. Justice taken in its oldest usage pertains to law, but specifically to a keeping of what is due or right. God did not create us destined for destruction. His due, is to redeem us. He persistently calls us to himself and provides himself as both the shepherd and the sacrifice. Such love is unmatched by anything merely human. This love is heard throughout time, from the Prophet Jeremiah in the 1st Reading, to the Gospel of Matthew, to today in our hearing. His love will never fail us.

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

JULY 25, 2021

*Trust in the Lord and he will provide for you.*

Today's Gospel is the story of the feeding of the multitudes with barley loaves and fish, which is the only miracle that is described in all four Gospels. Because of this, we know it has special significance that the Gospel writers wanted to impart to their disparate audiences, and to us. You may have caught on that it alludes to the story from the 1st Reading from 2 Kings, where the prophet Elisha feeds the starving people with barley loaves.

(And here's where I'll insert my plug for subscribing to a "Bible in a Year" podcast. I am listening to the one by Fr. Mike Schmitz and Todd (my husband) is listening to the one by Nicky and Pippa Gumbel from Alpha. We highly recommend both. The Bible is really fascinating, especially all of the allusions, fulfillment and connections between the Old Testament and New.)

All of these people from the surrounding areas followed Jesus because they saw the miracles he was performing. As they "hastened" to get to where he was going, others joined them, because they too wanted to listen to the man who had a message unlike any they had ever heard. Imagine the excitement! (It would be like your kids finding out that AJR was performing free in Millennium Park, telling everyone they met along the way!) In their rush, maybe they hadn't expected Jesus to teach for the

whole day, yet they were riveted and didn't want to leave. The inevitable hunger set in around dinnertime, and Jesus fed them, performed a miracle so they could eat.

They weren't so worried about their human needs, yet God provided for them. This reminds me of the story of Mary at Jesus' feet, listening to him teach. She was focused on Jesus and the teaching, not so much of the human needs of the household and other guests, and Jesus told her she was doing the right thing.

To me, these stories make the case that **God will provide and we need to trust in him**. Even when I err in planning, he provides. A few years ago, I had forgotten that I promised to get lunch for a deanery meeting (local priests and pastoral staff.) Mary Jane called me about ½ hour before the meeting to see if I was coming with the food. A small miracle occurred, and I was able to cobble together a spread from Costco and back to the rectory before the meeting started. That truly was God providing for all of us on that day!

*San Juan de la Maguana, Dominican Republic*

Established a job training school: St. Michael the Archangel Technical Professional School offers courses in computer data processing, word processing, sewing, beauty salon training and baking. It is now one of the top three professional training schools in the Dominican Republic, and the only one that does not charge tuition.



## FOUNDATION FOR CHILDREN IN NEED

*interior villages of Southern India*

Built several schools, boarding homes, a community health center and a home for the elderly. Provide free medical check-ups and medicine, as well as health education classes for teenage girls.



## SISTERS OF ST. FRANCIS

*Cuernavaca, Mexico*

Dealing with widespread poverty, where children as young as five years old might have to sell gum or trinkets so they can have food for the day. The sisters provide pastoral care, prison ministry, emergency services and health care, as well as various forms of assistance to families—from a meal to a pair of shoes to a small interest-free loan. They also offer educational support and mentoring to children.
