



# SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

# AUGUST 15, 2021

In today's gospel, Luke sets the stage for the arrival of Jesus Christ, establishing the cultural, religious, social and geographical setting of Jesus' entrance. The first event, after the long trek Mary took to visit her cousin Elizabeth, was the miraculous announcement of their pregnancies. During this encounter, the second sentence in the Hail Mary was created: "Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb." (Luke 1:42)

The Spirit of God in Elizabeth rejoiced in the presence of Mary through her unborn child. Have you ever been so excited, genuinely and unselfishly happy for someone? Do you have a friend that lifts you up as much as Elizabeth and Mary lifted each other up in this exact moment? Have you told them that lately? The fact that most of Luke puts the spotlight on two women during that time emphasizes to me how important the role of women really is in this world. It is empowering to see how much worldly and spiritual power and love is felt in this encounter.

Mary knew that her friendship with Elizabeth would allow for compassion and understanding of her situation. She was truly blessed and Elizabeth knew it before Mary could even tell her. Many of us have friends we can talk to and confide in. There may even be a hierarchy of different levels of friendships in your life, but is there anyone that you talk to as openly and freely about God as Mary and Elizabeth talk about God in this gospel?



As Elizabeth recognized God's presence in Mary, maybe we can help each other to start noticing God in our everyday lives. During these current times of fear and uncertainty, of living with restrictions and so many safety rules, embracing our ability to lift each other up with the help of the Holy Spirit could be the exact prescription we need to continue to trek through this long pandemic together. Together, not divided or isolated, but together as a village with the help of the Holy Spirit guiding us and showing us the way.

# **AUGUST 22, 2021**

Do you have to see a miracle to believe in miracles? Joshua asked the people which god they will follow. It was common among the people of this time to choose their god based on where they lived and who everyone else followed. The Israelites saw many miracles, so they believed in the Lord God—God brought them out of slavery, he protected them on their journey to the Promised Land and he drove out the people who dwelt there. Obviously they wanted only to worship that God who did all of this for them. The idea of "worshipping a god" might seem foreign to us in this day and age, but nowadays our gods can be fame, money, power, popularity, etc. It is up to each of us to choose the Lord God and to choose to have a relationship with him. To do this, we really have to put aside all of our other gods and focus on Jesus. What does your relationship with Jesus look like? Do you make time for him every day as you would money, popularity, etc...? Do you seek out Jesus? Do you want to get to know him better? (Shameless plug: One way to strengthen your relationship with Jesus is by joining us online for Alpha beginning September 23rd!)

Jesus asked his disciples in today's gospel reading from John, "Does this shock you?" Jesus had just asked them to eat his flesh and drink his blood. He explains that it is the spirit who gives life, not the flesh. He lost many of his disciples because of this but then he asked one last question of the twelve left, "Do you also want to leave?" We



are always given a choice. It is up to us to answer with a resounding "NO!" To say: we don't want to leave, but we want to know how to stay and grow closer to Jesus. We don't have to witness miracles the way the Israelites did to believe. We can believe by our faith alone. And through prayer, sacraments, service and liturgy, we can continue to grow in our relationship with Jesus.


