What we do not see, God notices and rewards. Finally, I am so grateful to the Archdiocese and our Cardinal, for trusting us as a parish to help form a newly ordained priest. Welcome Fr. Where can we improve:

REFLECTING ON SCRIPTURE

JULY 14, 2024 - FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1ST: Am 7:12–15 2ND: Eph 1:3–14 GOSPEL: Mk 6:7–13

Many of us have heard the term “helicopter parent” describing an overprotective approach to parenting, where the parent hovers like a helicopter getting overly involved in all the aspects of their child’s life. Jesus was not a parent to his disciples, rather their rabbi, or as we might call him, our teacher and mentor. Jesus was definitely not a “helicopter rabbi.” A “helicopter” approach can cause a sense of entitlement, increased anxiety and undeveloped life skills, which Jesus definitely did not want his disciples to have. To combat entitlement, Jesus had them rely fully on God to provide—sending them without tools, supplies and clothing. He made them learn to cope with anxiety dealing with rejection. He made them learn spiritual life skills being sent to serve in ministry without him by their side.

The Gospel that the disciples went to preach is not a prosperity Gospel, where we are coddled, told everything will be ok and we’ll always get what we want. If you hear that or want that, the tough truth is that it is not biblical. A mature faith must be willing to venture out with us into the challenges, struggles and suffering that are the realities of human life. I can imagine that the disciples

were greatly challenged by this mission. They probably talked with Jesus at length about their worries, fears and doubts. Like a supportive parent, Jesus probably had to reassure them and remind them that some day they would need to do this without him by their side. That’s why they have to go try it now when they can come back, feel his support, and get feedback to learn for the future.

It is important that we have this relational faith like the disciples. We need to be able to be honest with Jesus about our fears and doubts, but also trust when our faith calls us out of our comfort zone, to prioritize God in our life over other things, and even when we are called to repentance. We come to Mass each week to hear from Jesus, be sent out when “the Mass has ended” to “go in peace to love and serve the Lord,” then return to Jesus the next week for support and feedback. Be honest, accept the call to venture out, and always lean on Him.

JULY 21, 2024 - SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1ST: Jer 23:1–6 2ND: Eph 2:13–18 GOSPEL: Mk 6:30–34

“Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.” (Mark 6:31)

Jesus shows His disciples that following Him is about much more than doing things—accomplishing goals and achieving objectives in the world. Jesus had just sent his disciples out two by two, to begin spreading the Good News of the Kingdom. The disciples shared what they had seen and heard with Jesus, but there was so much more for them to receive. Jesus calls them back to rest, to simply be with Him and spend time with Him.

This simple human invitation on the Lord’s part reveals that, before anything else, discipleship is about friendship with Jesus, spending time with Him and getting to know Him. Before we can spread the good news about who He is and what He’s done, we have to encounter Him in our lives.

This happens first and foremost in prayer and the sacraments. In offering ourselves with Him at Mass

and receiving His body and blood, in receiving His mercy in the sacrament of reconciliation, and in spending some time each day to pray in silence with Him—with Scripture, the events of our day, and the interior movements of our hearts—we come to experience who Jesus is and how he desires to relate to us in the concreteness of our daily lives. He gives us these privileged places of grace, not as tedious burdens or boxes we need to check off, but as places of rest, places where we can be renewed in the truth of our identity as His beloved daughters and sons. Jesus commissioned us to “make disciples of all nations” (Matthew 28: 19); but we can’t give what we don’t have. We can’t tell people about a person we haven’t gotten to know ourselves. He invites each of us to rest with Him this week and to be strengthened in our knowledge of His love.

HANDS OF MERCY - OUTREACH


UNDERSERVED SCHOOLS
