

## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

### Do You Speak Stewardship?

If you are married, I'm guessing that you know the best way to break bad news to your spouse, whether you realize it or not. Maybe it's simply that you know not to talk about the budget after your wife's football team has lost. Maybe you know your husband will take the news that your sister is coming to stay a little easier if you tell him over his favorite dinner. We do the same thing with our children, our friends, our coworkers — we have all learned the language of the people we love.

The truth is the same in every language, but it's important for us to convey that truth graciously. That's what Pentecost teaches us. The gift of being able to speak in tongues afforded the Apostles a practical skill to spread the Gospel message, but it also served as a powerful symbol of the importance of effective communication. Evangelization can only happen when you're speaking in words a person is able, ready, and willing to hear.

Let's ask ourselves: what is the language we need to speak to share the truth with the person who is standing in front of us? Is it the language of quality time? The language of concern? The language of laughter and friendship? The language of authenticity, of plain talk and frankness?

The Holy Spirit gave the Apostles the ability to speak in tongues, and it seems miraculous when we read about it in the Gospels — but only consider that we all have this same ability, in a certain way. The Holy Spirit can and will show us how to speak the truth, if we only ask.

#### **Pentecost**

#### **Question:**

Why do we celebrate Pentecost when we do?

#### Answer:

The book of Acts unpacks the events immediately following Jesus' ascension into heaven. The Apostles and other disciples were told to pray in Jerusalem and await another outpouring of the Holy Spirit. As the weeks ticked on, the Jewish Festival of Weeks approached. This festival took place 50 days after Passover and celebrated the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The Festival of Weeks (or "Pentecost" in Greek) was a great pilgrimage feast, with Jews from all over the ancient world convening on Jerusalem for the celebration.

It was on Pentecost that God chose to send the Holy Spirit. Here, the new law of love was etched into the hearts of the disciples. As he burst out onto the balcony above the multinational crowd, Peter proclaimed the message of the resurrection, and the Holy Spirit enabled every listener to hear in their native language. 3,000 people were baptized that day! The disciples — and every baptized person — receives the gifts and zeal necessary to bring a new message of salvation to the people of God.

## Thoughts FROM... Brendan


Today we celebrate Pentecost, a time of renewal and invitation! Here we see the Holy Spirit descend upon the Apostles as tongues of fire, imbuing them with zeal for souls and empowering them to bravely go out and preach the Gospel.

How many times in our own lives have we found ourselves needing to be renewed in our faith? Much like the Apostles, I am willing to bet that there is a time when each of us has felt unprepared, unqualified, or unwilling to share Christ's love with another person. Whether that is out of fear of rebuttal or rejection, doubts about our knowledge on a particular topic, or whatever else, chances are good that we have wanted to hold our faith close to our chest, protecting it from the dangers of the outside world.

Here's the thing; we are not meant to keep our faith to ourselves. The same way that the Holy Spirit empowered the Apostles to go out and preach the Gospel, He wants to do the same for you. Maybe it won't be preaching in tongues or working miracles in someone's life, but in some way God has called you to live out a missionary vocation of sharing His love, mercy, and grace with those around you. He invites you deeper into your relationship with Him and His Church, and wants to remind you of your worth and how much He needs you.

We are all called to step out of our comfort zones. As Catholics we have the opportunity each day to encounter our Lord in the Sacraments and then carry Him out to our brothers and sisters, and through our conversations, our actions, and especially our prayer, we make Christ known.

God has invited you on this journey to Heaven. It's time to leave the room and start inviting others.

"Every single believer is vital and an important link in the chain of God's work. The Holy Spirit descended upon every one of the 120 who were there. It descended upon the young, as John Mark was probably a teenager. The Spirit descended upon the elderly, as Mary the mother of Jesus was in her late forties or early fifties, quite old for that day. The Spirit descended upon betraying cowards like Simon Peter and doubters like Thomas. It descended upon nationalistic Zealots like Simon and good ole boys' like Andrew. The Spirit visited the women who supported Jesus financially. It descended upon the brothers of Jesus who initially didn't believe. The Holy Spirit touched every one of them because every one of them was important. No one was omitted. Every single one of us is important and vital to what God is trying to accomplish through the Church."


