The Office of Diaconate Formation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Belleville is beginning a new cycle of recruitment and preparation of men for the Permanent Diaconate. Formation of the new class for ordination in 2028 will begin with a retreat in August of 2023 to start a period of aspirancy. The initial selection process for this class will begin with a series of "Come and See" events at various parishes around the diocese August through November 2022. You need only to attend one of the Come and See, gatherings. Potential applicants should review the schedule above for the locations and dates of these events in order to take advantage of the opportunity to attend and learn more about the permanent diaconate and the formation program. Applicants must be baptized Catholic men between the ages of thirty and sixty (at the time the formation program begins), active in the parish, and recommended by their pastors. Beginning in January 2023, the formal application process will begin.

Greetings to all as we observe the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Our first reading and Gospel this weekend speak to us about hospitality. In the Old Testament Hebrew Scriptures, Abraham and Sarah welcomed the three guests not knowing they were angels sharing the news that Sarah in her old age, though childless until then, would conceive and bear a child. In the Gospel we are reminded of Mary and Martha and how hospitality and listening to the Lord go hand in hand. Let us all show hospitality and listen to the Lord regularly in our lives!

Fr. Tulio Ramirez, **the missionary priest from Columbia**, South America who spoke at our weekend Masses two weeks ago, sends his gratitude for the donations given for his congregation's missionary endeavors. Thank you all for your generous support! As I have known Fr. Tulio for a number of years now and he knows my family as well, we had a very enjoyable trip for two days to see my family in Kansas.

This past Sunday evening there was a meeting with some of our seminarians who are living in the Murphysboro and Marion area, several priests in the area, and several young men who are considering a vocation to the priesthood. The gathering was held at the Newman Center. We prayed Evening Prayer together in the chapel, shared, had some pizza together, and then told our discernment stories regarding our calling or possible calling to the priesthood. It was a wonderful great conversion! If you are interested in a religious, priestly, diaconal, or lay ecclesial church vocation, please let me know so I can put you in touch with those in the diocese who are responsible for helping to discern these vocations. Also, **please pray for and encourage those you think may be called to these vocations.**

As I mentioned in my homily this past weekend, it is my hope and Bishop McGovern as well, that people subscribe to **The Messenger, our diocesan newspaper**, and also to be familiar with our **diocesan website, www.diobelle.org** to keep up on the latest Catholic news in our diocese, nation, and world. There are many excellent columns with assorted topics of spiritual and practical concerns, as well as letting people know what is going on in our diocese. Bishop McGovern also has a weekly column in English and Spanish. The cost is only \$30 a year and well worth your subscription.

Bishop McGovern's statement on the recent Supreme Court abortion decision is on the website as I mentioned in my homily. As he mentioned at the Mass he celebrated at Saint Francis Xavier the end of May, he will be releasing soon ways that we can help women considering abortion, or who want to keep their child but do not have the resources to do so. As we wait for these suggestions and directives from our bishop, we can, in the meantime help with donations to Pregnancy Matters in Carbondale. I am hoping we can have our donations crib set up soon, so we can start collection items soon. If you are interested in helping with this, please let me know.

This coming Sunday evening, July 17th, through Wednesday noon, the National Diaconate Institute for Continuing Education have asked me to coordinate and give presentations on ecumenism and interreligious relations to a group of about 125 deacons and their wives from around the country. It will be held at Holy Trinity Parish in Fairview Heights. Bishop McGovern will preside and preach at the opening Mass, and I have lined up colleagues in my ecumenical and interreligious connections from Saint John's University in Minnesota, Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, and the United States Bishops Conference in Washington, D.C. The conference was going to be held at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio in July of 2020, but had to be postponed due to the pandemic. Please keep us in prayer!

The Supreme Court Decision in Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health Organization

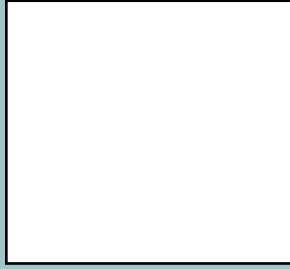

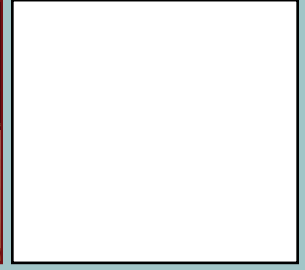

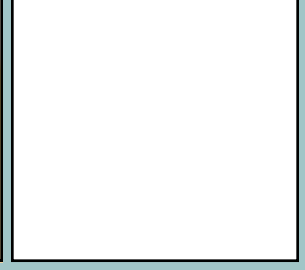
