EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Caught in the Rising Action

Think of some of your favorite iconic movies. I'm not talking about the feel-good comedies or the offbeat coming-of-age flicks. I'm talking about the movies that you found had a profound impact on you or made you go "Hmmm."

I'm willing to bet that the plot of this film features some tough moments and difficult scenarios. However happy the ending, at some point, the situation for the protagonist might look awfully hopeless. The script speaks some truth to you about what it is to be human in difficult circumstances. What it means to persevere.

We're attracted to the tension that exists when the hero is besieged. We're captivated by the decisions he makes in the darkest hour of the night when it seems like the dawn will never come. Why? Because we know that feeling so well. This is the essence of our human life on earth: waiting, hoping, doubting — and enduring.

We know the ending to our story, but we don't know when it's coming. We live our whole lives in the rising action of the narrative. Sure, it gets old. Tiresome, even dull. We may start to despair that the climactic scene is coming at all.

But faith is the realization of things hoped for, and evidence of things not seen. We feel it watching a great movie, because we recognize it intuitively: it is faith which earns the happy ending. No one is drawn to the story when the hero gives up or gets tired of waiting for the payoff. Everyday stewardship is the collection of choices we make while we're waiting, because we are called to action, not idleness, even in our perpetual state of expectation.

Thoughts FROM... Brendan

Today's readings talk about faith and about trust. Faith in the Lord and trust that he will not abandon us or leave us destitute, but rather that he will provide what we need to better encounter him and embrace our vocations.

The first reading talks about Passover and the people putting their faith in the Lord to be delivered from their foes. Their faith gave them courage and that courage resulted in their boldness in moving forward, glorifying the Lord for their freedom. How often do we trust the Lord in difficult circumstances?

The second reading talks of faith and obedience. I think the term "obedience" is one that many people tend to overlook. It is not hard to be Catholic. We go to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, go to confession when we need to, and receive our Lord in the Eucharist. Oftentimes we make mountains out of molehills and place other things in front of our spiritual health. Going to Mass might seem inconvenient at times or we just might not feel like it. This is where obedience, and I would argue, authentic love comes into play. Going to Mass even when we don't feel like we will receive anything out of it is an act of love in and of itself. The Lord asks us to come so by doing it, whatever the disposition, we show that we are desirous of growing in our relationship with him. Taking time for prayer when we feel we are "too busy" can assist us in making better decisions throughout our day, forming our conscience and inviting the Lord deeper into our lives. Abraham waited longer than he probably would have liked to have a family, but the Lord provided because he saw Abraham's unwavering faith. May we all have such faith.

The Gospel talks about being prepared. There are no shortcuts to sainthood. God calls each of us to live holy lives and invites us into a loving relationship with him and his church, but it is up to us. My prayer is that this week each of us may take another step closer to Christ on our walk towards heaven.
