WELCOME TO THE PARISH OF ST. BERNARD!



Dear Friends,

No doubt that you have heard something about the Traditional Latin Mass this past week; it seems that's all that's being talked about right now. At the center of the discussion is Pope Francis' latest *motu proprio* – a document that is issued personally by the pope and signed with his name. The holy father's latest document, entitled *Traditionis Custodes* (Guardians of the Tradition in English) limits the use of the Traditional Latin Mass. Pope Benedict had issued his own document during his papacy authorizing priests to celebrate the Traditional Latin Mass *sua sponte* (of their own accord). The document issued by Pope Francis returns the Traditional Latin Mass to the hands of the bishops, and requires priests to consult with the bishop before such Masses may continue. In most dioceses, bishops have authorized priests celebrating the Traditional Latin Mass to continue doing so while the document is studied more carefully and norms for each diocese are written and put into place. Bishop Hying had a wonderful pastoral letter to all in the Diocese of Madison, affirming the many graces and beauty of the Traditional Latin Mass. While some of our priests celebrate the Traditional Latin Mass regularly, I haven't studied the celebration of holy Mass under this form. There are elements in the Traditional Latin Mass that have great symbolic beauty, but until the Mass is understood and put into proper context, its beauty can often lie hidden behind the frustration of an unawareness of what's happening. The *Novus Ordo* (the Mass we celebrate today) relies much more heavily on the participation of the faithful. Oftentimes when you see representations of the Traditional Latin Mass back in the day, people would often be praying from their devotional book or perhaps saying a rosary while Mass was being celebrated. The tradition of the ringing of the bells at the time of consecration was established to alert the faithful to stop whatever it was they were doing and focus on the altar as the consecration was taking place.

As you can imagine, there have been a host of responses across the board to the holy father's document – from great support to extreme disdain. In the 13 years that the Traditional Latin Mass has enjoyed a bit more autonomy, devotion to it has grown substantially. As Bishop Hying stated, there are many beautiful elements and graces obtained from the Traditional Latin Mass, but there can arise a danger of superiority in which people feel that the Traditional Latin Mass rises above the *Novus Ordo* in terms of solemnity and importance. In other words, some people feel that only the Traditional Latin Mass will do – there is no place for the *Novus Ordo* in their life of worship and adoration of God. From my reading of the document, Pope Francis is sensitive to this feeling of superiority and the real possibility that some people may go so far as to reject the teachings of the Second Vatican Council. There is a lot of nuanced language in the document, and as Bishop Hying stated, it will take some time to digest, reflect on and clarify. In the meantime, things remain as usual here in the Diocese of Madison. I'll continue to touch on this document as things progress.

I've heard some rumors going around the parish again and feel the need to respond directly to the statement that I'm "selling the parish center." I have no idea where these rumors start and who puts the fuel in that gets them going. I have shared everything I know about the potential parish center redevelopment with all of you, and as developments occur, you are the first to know in my weekly column. Right now, we're at the stage where developers are working on a response to our Request for Proposal. They have until August 15th to return them to us, at which time, the discernment commission will review the responses in detail. We will be bringing our findings to the entire parish in a series of open meetings in which we can dialogue about what is being presented to us, and how best to move forward. I am neither for or against the potential redevelopment; I am, however, interested in doing what is best for the long-term viability and health of our parish family. For the record, I don't have any authority to "sell the parish center." The alienation of church assets is a long, complex, canonical process that involves several groups, including the bishop, the College of Consulters, the diocesan finance and building commissions, and potentially the Holy See itself, depending on the value of the transaction should we decide to move forward. Contrary to popular opinion, I can't just snap my fingers and magically make things happen. The Church has processes for everything, and they allow for thoroughness and prudence in undertaking something this big. I have nothing to conceal or hide from you; my model of openness and transparency has always been an essential part of my ministry among you, and it will continue to be that way. As I always do, I will keep you updated on the latest happenings regarding the potential redevelopment as we learn more information.


