WELCOME TO THE PARISH OF ST. BERNARD!



Dear Friends,

With the increase of the Delta variant of COVID-19, the CDC has issued new guidelines to encourage the wearing of masks in indoor spaces within areas designated as COVID spreading hotspots. As of this writing, we have yet to be designated as such, and Public Health Madison Dane County has not issued any new measures at this time. Masks are not required in the church; you may wear a mask if you feel more comfortable wearing one. If and when things change, I'll keep you updated via bulletin articles and Flocknote.

There seems to be a bit of confusion about taking the Eucharist to those at home, and I went to spend a bit of time in this weekend's column going through the steps so that everyone is clearly aware of the responsibilities entrusted to you when you are in possession of our Eucharistic Lord. When you take the Eucharist outside the church, you yourself becoming a living tabernacle as you take our Lord to those at home. You should conduct yourself in a way that reflects the importance of what you're doing. It can become very tempting to become complacent and forget your role. I would like to touch on the following points:

1. Holy Communion is to be taken to those at home, in the hospital and in rehabilitative care who are sick, homebound or cannot attend holy Mass themselves due to physical limitations. The Eucharist is not to be brought to people who feel it more convenient to have the Eucharist brought to them instead of attending Mass. If they are able to physically attend holy Mass, the Eucharist should not be brought to them at home.
2. You must be commissioned to bring the Eucharist to the ill and homebound. Just because you come into the possession of a pyx does not mean that you can simply bring the Eucharist to someone. Those who distribute Holy Communion at holy Mass are already commissioned; if you are not a communion distributor and have not been specially commissioned by myself or another priest to bring the Eucharist to ill and homebound, you must seek the commission before you exercise this ministry.
3. If you are bringing the Eucharist to someone, it should be brought to them immediately following Mass. No errands, no socials; immediately means immediately. If you cannot do this, then you should wait for another time in which you can fulfill this requirement.
4. The Eucharist should be brought immediately to the one who is to receive. If you discover that someone is not ready to receive when you bring the Eucharist to them, it is not acceptable to leave the pyx on a shelf or somewhere in the home until they're ready. If you encounter a situation like this, you may consume the Precious Body and bring the Eucharist at another time when the person is able to receive. Those who bring the Eucharist to the ill or homebound should always touch base with those receiving to make sure they're ready and able to receive on the day you bring it to them.
5. When you are transporting the Eucharist on your person, you should conduct yourself in a way that worthily reflects the sacredness of your ministry. Secular music or talk radio should not be played on the car radio (sacred music is OK) as you transport the Eucharist. Pray a rosary or travel in silence, reflecting on the importance of your ministry as you bring the Eucharist to those in need. A simple check as to whether or not you should be doing something is to ask yourself this question: "Would I do this while at Mass or while praying in church?" You are an extension of the holy Mass.
6. When you bring the Eucharist, you should follow the prescribed rubrics. At minimum, you should lead the communicant in a penitential rite and the praying of the Lord's Prayer. Ideally, you will read a reading from the Mass of the day, or another Scripture reading that you have with you. Someone who is homebound will be far more alert than someone who is on morphine and in hospice care. Use your judgment as to how much the communicant can handle in the time of your visit. You should not simply give them communion and then leave; as an extension of the holy Mass, your ministry helps the communicant prepare to receive our Eucharistic Lord. We don't just receive when we attend holy Mass; the same goes for visits outside Mass.

Gerri or I are happy to answer any questions you have. These guidelines help to foster reverence and devotion to the Lord in the holy Eucharist and minister effectively to those you visit.


