WELCOME TO THE PARISH OF ST. BERNARD!

Dear Parish Family,

The readings this week are perfect for our current parish focus on prayer. Be Bold, Rejoice, Proclaim, Gifts of The Holy Spirit and "Do whatever He tells you".

Moving from the readings to the Catechism of the Catholic Church #2558 "Great is the mystery of the faith!" "The Church professes this mystery in the Apostles' Creed (Be Bold) and celebrates it in the sacramental liturgy (Rejoice & Proclaim), so that the life of the faithful may be conformed to Christ in the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father (Gifts of the Holy Spirit). This mystery, then, requires that the faithful believe in it, that they celebrate it, and that they live from it in a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God. This relationship is prayer. " (Do whatever He tells you.)

Prayer as God's Gift #2559 Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." But when we pray, do we speak from the height of our pride and will, or "out of the depths" of a humble and contrite heart? He who humbles himself will be exalted; humility is the foundation of prayer, only when we humbly acknowledge that "we do not know how to pray as we ought," are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer. "Man is a beggar before God."

This month, we are asking each person (children too) to tell us if, how, and when you pray. What challenges you in your prayer time or what stops you from praying? This information is gathered anonymously, no names please. We plan to compile and share this information with you by the middle/end of February.

Core Lesson is a time for the whole parish - all ages — to meet once a month to share and learn about our Catholic faith tradition. All are welcome and the theme currently is prayer. We meet on the first Sunday of each month for an hour at 11:30am in the parish center. If you haven't joined us yet, call Georgia Strebe (608-249-9256, ext. 232) for more information.

THE IMPORTANCE OF SILENCE IN PRAYER

In today's world silence is typically defined as negative, which focuses on the absence of something. However, in order to learn how to grow closer to God through silence, we have to redefine that word. In his book, *The Power of Silence*, Cardinal Robert Sarah helps us to refocus on three key points.

Key Point 1: As in the book of Kings, Elijah is described here as "hearing" the silence of God. This is the first key point. Cardinal Sarah says: "Silence in prayer is not an absence. It is the manifestation of a presence, the most intense of all presences. In modern society, silence has come into disrepute; this is the symptom of a serious, worrisome illness. The real questions of life are posed in silence. Our blood flows through our veins without making any noise, and we can hear our heart-beats only in silence". When God is made manifest to Elijah in the sound of sheer silence, he knew that God was present and went forth to meet Him." When we listen to that silence, we are invited to go forth and walk with God. Enjoy your silent time with God.

Next week Key Point 2.: Relationships Mature in Silence
