WELCOME TO THE PARISH OF ST. BERNARD!

Dear Friends,

We're finally making progress on the new block wall that will cap the north end of the parish center from the demolition area. The weather has been a significant factor in the inability to complete this work in a timely manner. It's coming along! Continued progress is being made on the HVAC systems in the church and rectory, as well as the west church roof. Work will soon begin on the parking lot, and I'll have some updates to share with you in next weekend's bulletin.

The Mass calendar for 2025 has been published and is ready for scheduling. Beginning this weekend (July 13th and 14th) until the last weekend in September (September 28th and 29th), I am asking parishioners to limit 4:30pm Mass intentions and 10:00am Mass intentions to **three intentions** during this period. After the end of September, the limit will be lifted. These are our two most popular Mass times, and they fill up quickly. This will give everyone a chance who'd like to schedule a 4:30pm or 10:00am Mass time to be able to do so. Thanks for your understanding. It's good to have popularity! ☺

You'll notice that the new budgetary numbers for this fiscal year have been published in the bulletin. There has been a slight increase in the offertory budget to help cover increasing costs. Thank you for your generosity in the

coming year. I will be putting out a financial report for the past fiscal year in the near future so you can see where we ended up and how monies were spent.

This coming week is an exciting one for the entire Church here in the United States. People from across the country will be gathering in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress. Some pilgrim groups have been traversing toward Indianapolis on foot, and look forward to joining all Catholics in attendance as we celebrate Christ's presence in His Body and Blood. If you're able, I would encourage you to listen to coverage of the Congress' days (July 17th – July 21st). Both EWTN and Relevant Radio (1240AM) will be broadcasting from the Congress. Here is the gathering statement from the Congress web site:

God hears our prayers for the renewal of our Church. He will answer them through a life-changing transformation of our own hearts. The 10th National Eucharistic Congress is an invitation to experience profound personal revival so we can be sent out to share Christ's love with a world that so desperately needs it.

DID YOU KNOW?

On July 9, 1228, His Eminence, Stephen Cardinal Langton, the Archbishop of Canterbury, died. During this time period in England, King John wished to have absolute power and authority, enacting laws and proclaiming edicts whenever he wished and without consent from the barons. Cardinal Langton convinced the king to sign the *Magna Carta*, declaring that the barons had rights, and that his authority was not absolute.

John grew tired of Langton and asked to have him removed from his post as Archbishop. Langton outlasted the pope and the king, and was raised to become Primate of England. He is buried adjacent to the south transept at the Canterbury Cathedral.

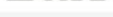
