

# From the Pastor's Desk



Today we celebrate Epiphany. Epiphany means to reveal, to show, or to make known. The enduring insight from the earliest days of Israel to our own modern Christianity is that God is not remote from us; God is actively involved... God cares... God is concerned.

In today's gospel reading, St. Matthew tells us that when Jesus was born in Bethlehem, magi from the East arrived in Jerusalem looking for the newborn king of the Jews. When

King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and asked the magi to bring him word of the child's whereabouts so that he too could honor him. When the magi found the child with Mary, his mother, they offered their gifts in homage. Warned in a dream not to return to King Herod, they departed for their own country by another way.

The good news of Epiphany is that Jesus reveals the mystery of God to be self-giving love. Jesus is the epiphany of the invisible God in all the events of his life: as a helpless child lying in a manger to a young man dying on a cross, which is the ultimate revelation that God's glory is love. This feast reminds us that each Sunday's liturgy with its gospel reading is an epiphany of the Lord to be reflected upon in prayerful study.

As in every offering of love, the Lord awaits the response of our hearts. We find God in the sacrament of everyday life. We encounter God in trials, sufferings, joys, triumphs, hopes, fears, defeats and successes that come to us each day. The epiphanies of life are not just about us. God is present in the way we serve our neighbor. God is the beggar outside our gate, the victim left on the side of the road and the voice of those who have no one to plead for their needs. We are not just called to be sensitive to God's presence within our own lives but we are also called to extend God's presence through our care for others. Each of us is called to be a living epiphany and a sacrament of God's love to the world around us.

God is with us. Sometimes all we have to do is take the time to open our eyes and see, open our ears and hear, open our hearts and feel the presence. May we all see and hear and feel the epiphanies of God in our lives this day and in each day to come.

I wish you an enjoyable weekend and a truly blest and faith-filled week.



# The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

# **Consecration to St. Joseph**

Beginning with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, we are offering to our parishioners and any friends they would like to invite, a Consecration to St. Joseph. Many of you might be familiar with or have heard of the Consecration to Mary, where through a period of prayer and gathering in a small faith group, you acknowledge Mary as our spiritual mother. The Consecration to St. Joseph is very similar to that. We acknowledge Joseph as our spiritual father and through prayer, group gathering, and discussion we seek integrate his virtues into our lives. When we see St. Joseph as our spiritual father, we also become more fully under his care and protection.

Some of the details of the consecration:

• We will begin on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord- February  $2^{nd}$ .

• The Consecration lasts for 33 days and will end on March 6<sup>th</sup> which is the First Sunday of Lent.

• The guide contains a short exposition on the Litany of St. Joseph and will require that you spend 20-30 minutes per day in prayer and meditation on this passage. If you miss a day, you can always make it up the following day.

• Information on the Guide: <u>The Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father</u> can be purchased at Marytown or online for \$14.95. There is also a Kindle version, for slightly less, available on Amazon. We have made arrangements with Marytown to have enough books in stock.

• There will be two types of weekly group meetings offered. Only one meeting per week is necessary. The first type will be a weekly gathering in person at a day and time to be determined that is best for the members of the group. The second option will be a weekly Zoom meeting. This will give people a choice in case they need to miss a meeting or weather forces us not to be able to gather in person.

• During one of the Masses on the First Sunday of Lent we will have the formal Consecration to St. Joseph.

• If you have already gone through the program of Consecration to Mary, it is more than appropriate to continue with the Consecration to St. Joseph.

# Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions?

There is a "Donate" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.



You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be emailed/mailed to you at your request.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.

Direct debits and credit cards can be processed dependent on your preference. Please see below for options. If you require a different schedule please call Barb Ruhl, in the parish office.






