

From the Desk of Deacon Chris Savage



There are many events in the life of a child that a parent holds dear, the first usually being the day of their birth. Each year parents celebrate their child's birthday with family and friends and gifts. And why is this day such an important day to celebrate? Because it's a reminder of the day that their family grew by welcoming another member into it. As challenging as family can sometimes be, there is joy in sharing life with family.

Perhaps an even more special event in our lives that we should celebrate all the more is the day of our baptism. When we are born we become members of our immediate family and our relatives. Through baptism we become members of an even greater family, that of the entire family of God, and what a joyous occasion it is! The sin of Adam and Eve may have separated our relationship with God, but not from His love. "For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten son", "so that we might receive adoption as sons...so you are no longer slaves but a son, and if a son then also an heir, through God." The love that God has for every person He creates and is born into a human family is so strong that He desires that we all be united with Him. God does not want us to live in death, but filled with life and His love. Baptism reunites us with Him through Jesus. This is truly something worth celebrating. In baptism we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, just as we see in today's Gospel, when the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus in bodily form like a dove. And finally we hear the Father speaking from heaven in the words, "You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased." We imagine that at every baptism, including our own, that God speaks these same words to us as we are reunited with Him.

If you are still looking for a New Year resolution for 2022, consider marking your calendar of the date of baptism for each member of your family and celebrate it with as much joy and celebration as you would for a birthday. What could be more exciting than to remember the day that each one of us were restored to life as a member of the family of God.

A Follow Up from Catholic Charities

On behalf of Catholic Charities, I would like to thank those who donated gift cards to the Christmas Share Program this year. Many children were served in Lake County and were able to have Christmas gifts because of your donation. I'd like to share a couple of observations that were shared with me about this year's program.

First, people stepped forward to donate despite the challenges of the pandemic. The people who run the program have noticed this year that there was a definite trend toward a need for the newly poor. Your help with the donations is a testament to everyone who gives and provides for others from their abundance.

The second observation is more of an individual story about how the impact of this program can be felt for those in need. Registrations for receiving gifts are asked for in the early part of the fall. People fill out the number of children they have as well as their wishes. They also give their clothing sizes and such, so that some needs as well as wants can be purchased. When filling out the registration, one family said that they had five children that would love to have gifts. When the time for the actual drive happened, they had taken in another family member from Honduras. The child was dressed in pajamas and wrapped in a blanket. Because of donations such as ours, this child was served as well.

What a wonderful and tangible example of how we can serve the least among us! Thanks again!

Are you familiar with SPRED?

SPRED, Special Religious Education, is a program that is specifically designed to meet the spiritual needs of persons with developmental disabilities. It is a <u>world-wide</u> program of religious education that has opened doors in parish communities for persons with special needs for over 40 years. SPRED invites and trains volunteers to be "catechists" (a person who shares their faith) to work in a beautifully prepared environment where they can welcome persons with developmental disabilities.

Through the experience of friendship in one to one relationships, our friends with disabilities discover a place of belonging. Through participation in a SPRED faith community, friends with special needs are better able to celebrate the sacraments and enter more fully into the worshipping experiences of the whole Church. Ultimately, SPRED is a process that builds faith community helping parishes fully live the scripture: "So we, though many, are One Body in Christ." (Rom 12:4)

SPRED groups work in the following chronological age groups:
Children 6-10, adolescents 11-16, young adults 17-21 and adults 22 & older.

Our group here at Prince of Peace serves adults, 22 & over. At this time our group has 3 open spots.

I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?

What is the Elijah Cup?

The purpose of the Elijah Cup, a chalice, used during the Consecration of the Mass, is to provide a focal point for prayer. We are all aware of the need for vocations to the priesthood, the permanent diaconate and to the religious life. But sometimes we forget just how powerful praying for an increase in vocations can be. If we pray with the faith of the widow of Zarapeth, our cup will never run dry! We will always have priests to bring us Jesus in the Eucharist.



Background

In 1 Kings 17, during a drought, Elijah tells the poor widow of Zarapeth that if she makes him a small loaf of bread with the last of her flour and oil, her "jar of flour will not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the Lord sends rain upon the earth." In faith, the widow baked the bread and fed Elijah. For the next year, the widow, her son, and Elijah ate bread made from the bowl of flour and jug of oil.


How does it work?

Each month, a family, a couple, or individual, has the opportunity to bring a chalice that has held the Consecrated Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ into their homes. The Elijah Cup serves as a focal point encouraging family prayer for religious vocations, for seminarians and for our serving religious. It is a powerful presence and inspires prayer from adults and children alike.

A Focal Point of Prayer for Vocations

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support God's call to religious life. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured through prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women He is calling in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray for vocations daily.

Interested families or individuals should contact Fr Gerald Walsh, or the Parish office to schedule a month to take the Elijah Cup home. At the end of Mass, (the second weekend of the month, usually the 9:30 am Family Mass) the Elijah Cup will be presented to the family or individual by a Deacon or Priest. The family will then take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day for a month, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family will pray for an increase and perseverance of vocations. The Elijah Cup should be brought back the second weekend of the month so it can be presented to a new family.



Consecration to St. Joseph

Beginning with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple on February 2nd, we are offering to our parishioners and any friends they would like to invite, a Consecration to St. Joseph. Many of you might be familiar with or have heard of the Consecration to Mary, where through a period of prayer and gathering in a small faith group, you acknowledge Mary as our spiritual mother. The Consecration to St. Joseph is very similar to that. We acknowledge Joseph as our spiritual father and through prayer, group gathering, and discussion we seek integrate his virtues into our lives. When we see St. Joseph as our spiritual father, we also become more fully under his care and protection.

Some of the details of the consecration:

- We will begin on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord- February 2nd.
- The Consecration lasts for 33 days and will end on March 6th which is the First Sunday of Lent.
- The guide contains a short exposition on the Litany of St. Joseph and will require that you spend 20-30 minutes per day in prayer and meditation on this passage. If you miss a day, you can always make it up the following day.
- Information on the Guide: <u>The Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father</u> can be purchased at Marytown or online for \$14.95. There is also a Kindle version, for slightly less, available on Amazon. We have made arrangements with Marytown to have enough books in stock.
- There will be two types of weekly group meetings offered. Only one meeting per week is necessary. The first type will be a weekly gathering in person at a day and time to be determined that is best for the members of the group. The second option will be a weekly Zoom meeting. This will give people a choice in case they need to miss a meeting or weather forces us not to be able to gather in person.
- During one of the Masses on the First Sunday of Lent we will have the formal Consecration to St. Joseph.
- If you have already gone through the program of Consecration to Mary, it is more than appropriate to continue with the Consecration to St. Joseph.

Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions?

There is a "Donate" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.

You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be emailed/mailed to you at your request.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.






