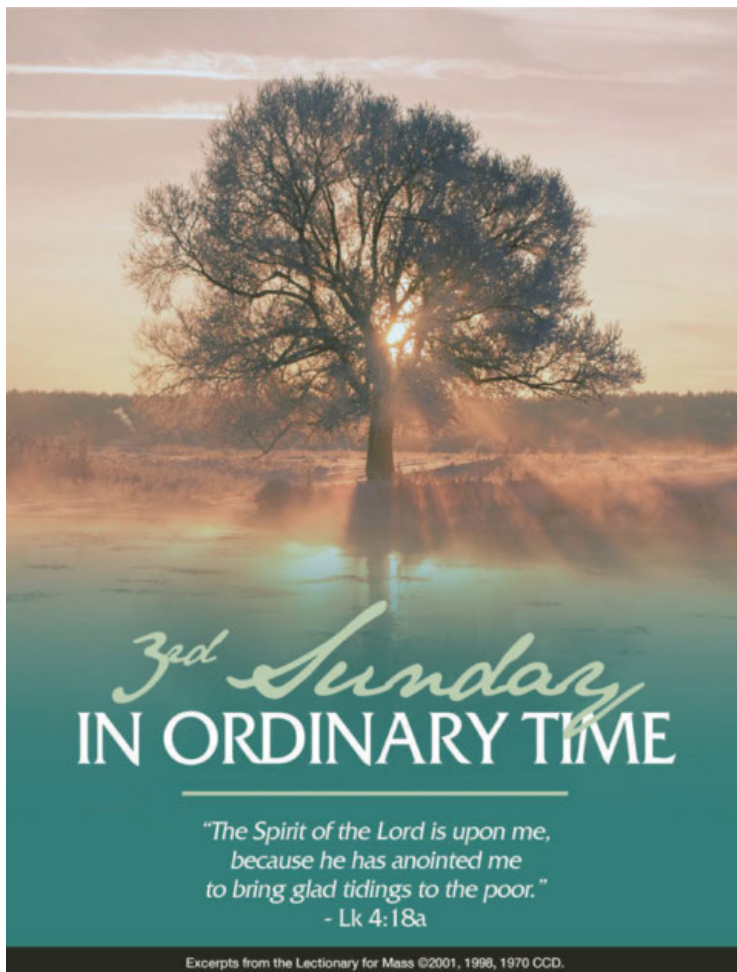

## *From the Pastor's Desk*



What do you read every day to nourish your mind, to feed your mind and what do you not read because it does not uplift or delight you or would corrupt your mind? What TV programs do you watch and what TV programs do you not watch because they are not uplifting you? We decide how to nourish our minds, how to feed our minds by choosing what to read and watch, and we decide how to protect our minds by not reading or watching what does not uplift us.

What would feed our minds and uplift our minds most of all? The simple and most obvious answer is the Bible, because it is the Word of God. That is why in our first reading Ezra the priest read the Law, an excerpt of the Old Testament, to the Jews in Jerusalem and why in our Gospel Jesus read from the Scriptures in the synagogue in Nazareth. That is why we read Sacred Scripture every time we assemble here for Mass or some other liturgy. That is why we are encouraged to read our Bibles at home every day. The Bible is the Word of God and is therefore the most nourishing food for our mind each day.

Sometimes we forget how precious the Word of God is, in fact, Jesus is present in the Mass through four ways: the Eucharist, the Priest, Bishop or Deacon, **the Liturgy of the Word/Gospel** and the Assembly/Congregation.

A famous preacher and theologian in the third century, Origen, expressed it like this, "You receive the body of the Lord with special care and reverence lest the smallest crumb of the consecrated gift fall to the floor. You should receive the word of God with equal care and reverence lest the smallest word of it fall to the floor and be lost." What a beautiful way to say that hearing the Word of God is important.

We have an opportunity to hear the Word of God each time we come here. Try to go home after each Mass with some idea from the readings or their explanation in the homily in your mind. What is the Lord saying to me, when I hear these readings from Scripture proclaimed and explained. If we don't ask ourselves or contemplate what the Lord is saying it should be no surprise if we do not hear the Lord.

I began by asking questions about what way we nourish our minds. Try to nourish your mind every day by feeding it with Sacred Scripture for at least a few minutes. I think St. Gregory said it best, "The Bible is a love letter sent by God to his people in which we can perceive the heart of God."

I wish you an enjoyable weekend and a truly blest and faith-filled week.

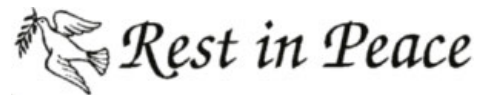
A group setting provides a safe place where stories of our deceased loved ones can be shared, and feelings may be expressed. It is also here that the “new normal” can begin to happen.

## Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions?

There is a "Donate" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.



You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be emailed/mailed to you at your request.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.

## Consecration to St. Joseph

Beginning with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, we are offering to our parishioners and any friends they would like to invite, a Consecration to St. Joseph. Many of you might be familiar with or have heard of the Consecration to Mary, where through a period of prayer and gathering in a small faith group, you acknowledge Mary as our spiritual mother. The Consecration to St. Joseph is very similar to that. We acknowledge Joseph as our spiritual father and through prayer, group gathering, and discussion we seek integrate his virtues into our lives. When we see St. Joseph as our spiritual father, we also become more fully under his care and protection.

Some of the details of the consecration:

- We will begin on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord- February 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- The Consecration lasts for 33 days and will end on March 6<sup>th</sup> which is the First Sunday of Lent.
- The guide contains a short exposition on the Litany of St. Joseph and will require that you spend 20-30 minutes per day in prayer and meditation on this passage. If you miss a day, you can always make it up the following day.
- Information on the Guide: [The Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father](#) can be purchased at Marytown or online for \$14.95. There is also a Kindle version, for slightly less, available on Amazon. We have made arrangements with Marytown to have enough books in stock.
- There will be two types of weekly group meetings offered. Only one meeting per week is necessary. The first type will be a weekly gathering in person at a day and time to be determined that is best for the members of the group. The second option will be a weekly Zoom meeting. This will give people a choice in case they need to miss a meeting or weather forces us not to be able to gather in person.
- During one of the Masses on the First Sunday of Lent we will have the formal Consecration to St. Joseph.
- If you have already gone through the program of Consecration to Mary, it is more than appropriate to continue with the Consecration to St. Joseph. If you are interested, would like to register, or have any questions, contact Deacon Jim at the parish office.

## Are you familiar with SPRED?

SPRED, Special Religious Education, is a program that is specifically designed to meet the spiritual needs of persons with developmental disabilities. **It is a world-wide program of religious education that has opened doors in parish communities for persons with special needs for over 40 years.** SPRED invites and trains volunteers to be “catechists” (a person who shares their faith) to work in a beautifully prepared environment where they can welcome persons with developmental disabilities.

Through the experience of friendship in one to one relationships, our friends with disabilities discover a place of belonging. Through participation in a SPRED faith community, friends with special needs are better able to celebrate the sacraments and enter more fully into the worshipping experiences of the whole Church. **Ultimately, SPRED is a process that builds faith community helping parishes fully live the scripture: “So we, though many, are One Body in Christ.” (Rom 12:4)**

**SPRED groups work in the following chronological age groups:  
Children 6-10, adolescents 11-16, young adults 17-21 and adults 22 & older.**

Our group here at Prince of Peace serves adults, 22 & over. At this time our group has 3 open spots. If you are interested in becoming involved in SPRED or would like more information on the SPRED program please feel free to call Tina Martz at 224-399-7810. Volunteers are always welcome and if you have a family member or know of someone who may benefit from our ministry please contact Tina. Participants, “Friends” do not need to be parishioners of Prince of Peace.
