

FROM THE PASTOR

Many people give their allegiance to something until they are asked to do something challenging or radical. Then

they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The same holds true for God. Either we serve God, or we don't.

There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is truly Jesus' Body and Blood. For some, these things may prove too difficult, but truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we find it? The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship.

In our St. Luke and St. Bernardine Parish, we are blessed to have the ministry of two full-time priests, (Fr. Ed Fialkowski as associate pastor and myself as pastor). Moreover, we have two resident priests who help in celebrating Masses at both campuses: the well-known Fr. Leroy Wickowski and newcomer Fr. Krzysztof (Kris) Swierczynski. Since Fr. Kris just joined us at the beginning of July, I would like to tell you a little bit about him.

Fr. Kris was born in Poland, where he spent most of his childhood. In 2002, after the last visit of Saint John Paul II into the country, he entered the seminary in Kielce. During his studies at the seminary, Fr. Kris was invited to come to the Archdiocese of Chicago, where he continued his formation. After a year of an ESL program at the University Illinois Chicago, he continued his studies at the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. He was ordained by Cardinal Francis George in 2012 and was assigned to St. Mary Riverside Parish as an associate pastor. In his sixth year at the parish, he was asked to go for further studies at St. Paul University in Ottawa, Canada, where he studied Canon Law and obtained his licentiate in 2021. On July 1, he was assigned as a resident priest at our parish while continuing his full-time assignment at the Archdiocese's Metropolitan Tribunal. Fr. Kris' hobbies are books and good music. He is happy to be part of the community of St. Luke and St. Bernardine Parish!



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

New beginnings for our retiring Director of Religious Education

For the first time in over 33 years, Ann Stauffer has a new mission. Instead of coordinating and planning the Religious Education Program (REP) for St. Bernardine children, she will be planning and coordinating her retirement.

Through all those years, Ann has touched many lives as head of the REP. First, and primary, are all the students and their families. This was always her priority, doing it with love, compassion, and faith. Next are all the "volunteers" whose arms she gently twisted to help the program in many ways. 


Ann planned the curriculum as well as many nonclassroom events to reinforce what was taught in the classroom. The Halloween paraliturgy brought the saints to life for the students, especially those who participated in the service. Ann often came dressed as a saint herself to start the program. She seemed to take just as much delight from putting candy canes in the students' shoes left in the hall on St. Nicholas Day as the students did in finding the treat.

Advent always had her leading a weekly prayer service starting with the song "Light the Advent Candle," which most of us will never forget. When the student body was larger, she coordinated colorful Christmas pageants, and she also coordinated the Holy Family procession during the Christmas Family Mass. Lent gave her an opportunity to devise new ways for the students to participate and prepare their hearts and minds for Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

First Communicants and their families learned from Ann the importance of receiving Jesus into our body and souls and the importance of sharing the "meal" with others. *Confirmandi* learned through Ann that becoming a full member of the Church was much more than the rite of the Sacrament of Confirmation — it meant sharing our gifts with others, especially those who did not have as much as they did.

Ann knew the importance of prayer and community. She knew it took the whole "church family" to help

She arranged for a speaker at the beginning of each school year to inspire the teachers and assistants in their mission of educating and conveying the faith to the students. She made sure the catechists had input each year into what worked and what could be done to improve the program. Though she thanked the teachers and volunteers in many ways, probably the best way was her "Winter Doldrums" party with its white elephant gifts — and Ann always made sure she got one of the "treasures." There was much laughter at those parties.

Thank you, Ann, for all that you have done for St. Bernardine over the years. You helped make all of us better people. We look forward to seeing you now as just another member of our St. Luke and St. Bernardine Parish and recounting some of the memories from the past.

If anyone is wondering what Ann is going to be doing in retirement, put your mind to rest. Much of her time will be taken up making homemade apple pies — with real crusts made by hand, not with any machine — something that she promised to be making when she had more time.

New switch from Sundays to 24/7 for streamed Masses at St. Luke Church

Starting this weekend, all of the Masses at St. Luke, as well as St. Bernardine, will be live-streamed on **YouTube**. We have set up cameras so you can join the daily Masses as well as Eucharistic Adoration and Sunday services at home or wherever you may travel.

We are discontinuing the Sunday-only livestream on Facebook to be able to show one continuous feed on YouTube for both churches. The YouTube links are

The main difference you will find is that YouTube only records for 12 hours at a time, so if you miss the start of a Mass you will need to click back on the timeline to find the beginning, and each day's Masses will disappear after 12 hours. However, everyone will now be able to join live online every Mass at both churches.




