

FROM THE PASTOR

As you know, I was supposed to be back from my vacation in Poland on October 1, but unfortunately I broke my left leg

during my first week there, and my plans had to change. My healing process is going well — the bone, while broken was not dislocated. My leg must remain in a cast until October 28, at which time I am scheduled for another X-ray and the orthopedic doctor will let me know when I may safely fly back to the U.S. One positive aspect of this situation is that I am staying with my elderly parents in their apartment for a length of time that I have never experienced in my adult life.

This necessary delay of my departure from Poland has resulted in my absence during the time when our new Mass schedule was announced. Since we united as a new parish, we have known that a new schedule would be required. I prayed over this many times and discussed the matter with Father Ed and the members of the Worship Committee before we presented our proposal to the Unification Committee. After more discussion and prayer, a new Mass schedule was created and will be implemented the weekend of October 23-24.

I am aware that because of the changes, some parishioners may be feel hurt because their favorite Mass has been rescheduled or even cancelled. I truly apologize for that, but the changes were necessary. At this time, I would like to express my gratitude to members of the Worship Committee and the Unification Committee who dedicated their talent, time, and prayers during this process. Their support was very helpful.

I had really wished to be present in the parish at the time the Mass changes were announced, but my health condition did not allow that. I pray that the changes in the Mass times will be recognized by our parishioners as necessary and be accepted. Parishioners will have an opportunity to evaluate the changes in the first quarter of 2022.

As we move forward in the RMC process, some staff changes have also become necessary. As you know, the St. Luke campus will be the main church office where all sacramental records will be stored and the daily business operations of the parish will be conducted. It is with great sadness that I say "goodbye" to Kathy Teska, from the St. Bernardine campus office, who has served as the parish secretary for over 21 years. Daniel Szymanski, the business manager at the St. Luke campus, has taken on a new position at St. Alphonsus Parish in Chicago. Please

This mindset also fuels damage inflicted on the environment, which especially adversely impacts the poor. But when it is an innocent human being's very existence a moral absolute — that is thrown away, it is a sign that society has truly become severely disordered.

This is especially a time for Catholics, whose faith calls us to advocate for the universal good of a consistent ethic of life, in every stage and in every condition, to call our country back to respect for human life. And this is especially so for Catholics who are prominent in all walks of public life — entertainment, media, politics, education, the corporate world, and so forth — as they have such a powerful influence on shaping the

attitudes and practices of people in our nation.

Abortion is the axe laid to the roots of the tree of human rights: when our culture encourages the violation of life at its youngest and most vulnerable condition, other ethical norms cannot stand for long.


