St. Gertrude has an opportunity for a full-time Maintenance Supervisor. *This position provides maintenance for parish/school buildings and grounds, including semi-skilled carpentry, simple plumbing and electrical work, painting and other minor repair work. Troubleshoots, repairs, and maintains plumbing, mechanical and electrical systems. Conducts preventative maintenance inspections and performs required maintenance actions such as lubrication, cleaning and filter changes. Grounds work may include mowing, pruning and ice and snow removal with grounds equipment. It also includes supervising other maintenance and grounds employees.*

Duties & Responsibilities:

Instructs and monitors maintenance staff in general custodial tasks.

- o Trains and reviews employee performance
- o Establishes daily work assignments
- o Reviews and approves time sheets
- o Sets up facilities for parish events

Works with volunteers as needed

Oversee and perform routine and preventative maintenance for church, school, parish offices, and a large parish hall with cafeteria and gym.

Supervises cleaning of church, school and other parish buildings.

Maintaining grounds: mows, performs snow removal with hand shovels and snow plows, blows walkways on a seasonal basis

Performs maintenance of the rectory, church, school and/or other church buildings

Performs minor repairs/upkeep on equipment (truck, mowers, golf carts)

Collects and disposes of trash and garbage

Maintains an inventory of supplies for lighting and cleaning and orders supplies as requested

Obtain contractor bids for major repairs and present proposals to Pastor for review and approval

Coordinates with pastor on building conditions and repair status

Knowledge & Experience Requirements:

HVAC maintenance knowledge highly desirable

Knowledge of and experience with light carpentry work required

Knowledge of and experience with minor building repairs

Must have strong work ethic, good analytical and communication skills with basic mechanical aptitude and capability

Skills & Attitudes Required for Success in Job:

General knowledge and support of the Catholic Church, Catholic sacraments, Catholic rites and liturgies

Must have necessary mechanical skills and the ability to work safely with machinery and equipment requiring considerable caution

Please help if you can by dropping off items at the pantry. If the pantry is full, please leave items at the rectory and they will be picked up and stored for use later.

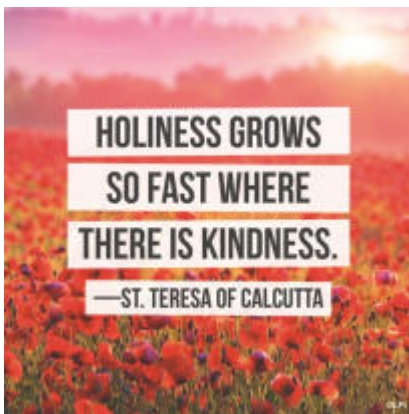

July 11: Ordinary Time – Two by Two Dynamic Catholic, Alive! – Two by Two

As we are seeing an end to the pandemic in the near future, many are wondering "are people going to come back to Church?" Maybe the question should be "what are we going to do to invite people back?" Some parishes have decided to contact parishioners that they haven't heard from in a while and invite them back. But, if we haven't seen them prior to the pandemic, what was changed at our parish to encourage them to return? Instead, let's use today's Gospel as a model – let's go out "two by two" and walk with people in their faith journey. Let's train our parish disciples to be disciple-makers. Instead of starting big and calling people that were lukewarm to begin with, let's start small and train our "on fire" disciples how to lead small faith groups and how to easily share their faith story with others. Then, encourage people in our small faith groups to go out and do the same – this is called spiritual multiplication. The key – we need to personally invest in a few people at time and accompany them in their faith journey.
