

Last weekend, we closed the Christmas Season with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. As we did so, we reminded ourselves of the responsibilities of our own Baptisms. That is, we are to continue to carry out the work of Jesus Christ and to extend knowledge of Him throughout the whole earth.


