# Ramblings of the Pastor

A young child asked, "Why did the three kings. come after Christmas?" An older sibling responded, "They didn't ask for directions." J This feast of the Epiphany celebrates salvation coming to the Gentiles. They did not have the direct revelation of an angel, as did Joseph, Mary and the shepherds that the Messiah has come. We, like most believer, also do not have direct revelation of an angel. That is another reason why this feast was so important to early Christians. Both Easter and this feast of the Epiphany predate the celebration of Christmas. This feast shows the important of our faith and our acting upon that faith. Most Christians come to know Christ by having faith to seek him, like the wise ones, who had the faith to follow the star. Let us pray for the faith to always seek Christ.

Since this feast celebrates salvation going beyond the house of Israel to all. There is an ancient tradition of blessing your homes using chalked blessed on this day. A home may be blessed using the blessed chalk by marking the wall or door mantle with 20+C+M+B+22, the year split by the Latin initials for May Christ bless this house (Christus Mansionem Benedicat) or the traditional names for the three wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. This Epiphany tradition indicates that the family is committed to welcoming Christ and trusting in God to protect their family against evil. The blessing of the home with chalks also gives God's blessing upon all who enter or exit the home throughout the year. Please consider blessing your homes with chalk as a public witness of your family commitment to Christ.

Lord, hold our troops in Your loving hands.

Protect them as they protect us. Bless them and their families for the selfless acts they perform for us in our time of need - Amen




