St. Hilary of Poitiers Bishop and Doctor of the Church January 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.



St. Joseph's Corner

Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

Today we celebrate an event of enormous importance in the lives of all Christians, though many times it passes at the end of the Christmas season without a lot of fanfare or focus. Today is the day, by the way, you can finally take down your Christmas Tree. However, in some cultures the Christmas tree stays up and even is redecorated for Marci Gras until Fat Tuesday.

Our focus is on Jesus entry into public ministry which is preceded by an important ceremonial washing, a cleansing of sin. Yet we know, that Jesus does not have any sin to be cleansed of. So what is going on here that St. John the Baptist must baptize Jesus. The truth of the matter is that this is an instance and foreshadowing of the cross at Calvary. Jesus here identifies as, and identifies with the sinner by presenting himself for cleansing by St. John. In fact, this action itself sanctifies and sacramentalizes baptism itself. Jesus later will identify as a sinner and die on behalf of all sinful humanity at Calvary, redeeming all of humanity. Just as through one man all became subject to the fall, through one man all may be cleansed of their sins and be forgiven. This action of Jesus is intimately connected with the cross and his saving work. In the Christmas Season this event not only foreshadows but is also probably the most important in regards to our salvation and what it is that Jesus does for us.

Do you know anyone in your life that seems suspect or that perhaps do not get the benefit of the doubt? Do you know anyone who may not deserve a second chance? Do you know anyone who would be considered as "them" or "other?" The reality is that Jesus died for them just as much as he died for you. How and in what ways might we as Christians "die" or sacrifice of ourselves for those who are of ill repute? Sometimes it does mean keeping healthy boundaries but also keeping that individual in prayer, sometimes justice requires a forgiveness, and sometimes justice even requires a reconciliation. Each situation and relationship is different. But each situation requires careful reflection as truly, Christ is there in that person who needs our prayers at the very least.




