Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

Have you ever been incensed by what someone has said to you? In today's Gospel reading we don't know it quite yet (if you keep reading you will see), but everything that happens and finally with Jesus reflection on the reading from Isaiah certainly does incense people. We always picture Jesus as meek and humble, which are indeed qualities he possess. Here he makes a point of revealing who he is at Synagogue.

What this tells us is that Jesus is a polarizing figure in many ways. His existence itself challenges our understanding of who God is and what God would or would not do for humanity is challenged. It challenges our preconceived notions and much of the wisdom we have gained from the world, of which, the world is a cold and calculating place.


This Gospel teaches us that we need to simplify our understanding of who God is, to not be so challenged by others views and simply reflect the God that we know who is Christ. Is Jesus knowable? I believe so, through the testimony of the Apostles, the revelation of Scripture, and the witness of the bishops in union with Pope Francis. We can say with certainty who Jesus is, with a well formed conscience and through prayer. How do we have a well formed conscience? First by attending Mass regularly, and secondly by knowing our Catechism well or in summary: unlocking the meaning of the Creed, the meaning of the sacraments, knowing the commandments and beatitudes, and understanding the depth of the Our Father which is the heart of Christian prayer.

If Christ has a claim on our lives and we live as such it will make the world a better place to live for all, because we will become a source of blessing for others. Refraining from any kind of gossip or hard speech, moderating our passions or desires, giving to those in need, being a person of welcome to those who are cast as unwelcome by society, and all together be known as a fool believing in peace and hope for the future. We have Hope because we

know the damage that sin brings, and that we as Christians bring the healing balm of Christ through the grace of his presence in us. Come Lord Jesus!




