St. Blaise | February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



Ramblings of the Pastor

Our sixth president, John Quincy Adam, once said, he would rather be a street cleaner than be in politics. However, motivated by duty, he has been the only ex-president to serve in the House of Representatives after leaving office. His popularity was not the greatest but he was a defender of Native Americans and women's rights. The prophet Jeremiah reports he was not a prophet because he wanted it, but because God chose him. The prophet Jeremiah was unpopular and, like Adam, would have done something else. As St Paul illustrates, the key is love, and self-sacrificing service to others. Love drives the sacrifice that allows one to carry out duty to God, family, community and others, even when doing so is unpopular. Love does not direct us to do what is popular, or what feels good. It calls us to put aside childish things and seek the things that last, like Faith, Hope and Love. God calls us to sacrifice ourselves for the good of others, our family and community as Jesus did.

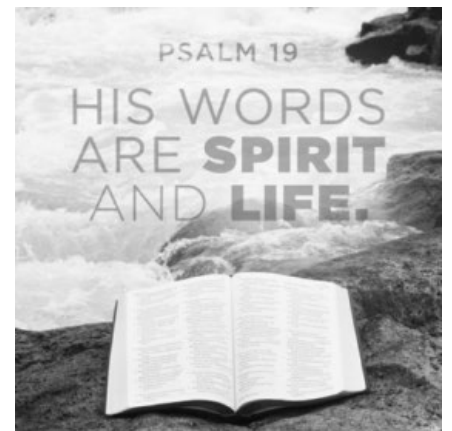
Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

The people at the synagogue are initially enamored with Jesus, though soon turn sour over Jesus words. Frustration boils over after Jesus perceives conflicted hearts in regard to his reading and interpretation of Isaiah relating to himself, giving a small glimpse of the fact that he is the Messiah. Some in the crowd ask, "is this not Josephs Son" derisively. In response Jesus shares scriptural evidence that in the past prophets were not welcome in their homelands. He recalls that even in famine Elijah visited the widow in Sidon, even during great plague Elisha only cleansed Naaman the Syrian. Indicating that neither were welcome in Israel, despite truly being the greatest of the prophets.

I think in many ways this illustrates for us the reason why Jesus seeks our friendship in ordinary means and hidden extraordinary graces. It is easy to reject God in the ordinary, but even more so when God breaks into our world through a prophet, vision, or even by Christ himself. We may say now, that we need a sign, some kind of insurance to ensure we are thinking the right thing or that we believe something undeniably true. Yet, the requirement of proof we create is always an illusion because we will never be satisfied with whatever bar of proof we set. Jesus wants us to move outside of ourselves to see his true presence sitting right under our noses. If you are conflicted about the presence of Christ in your life pray for the gift of faith. If you don't know how to pray freely ask our Blessed Lord for help. At the same time waste time, give God the space in your life to respond. Knowing Christ is more than simple silly proofs, because Jesus is a person who calls us to something deeper and greater than ourselves. He calls us to friendship and an inheritance into the inner life of the Holy Trinity

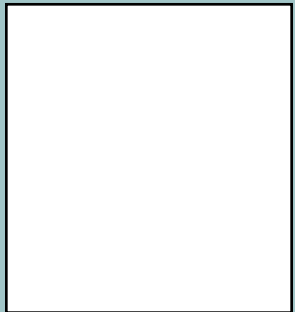
