

St. Joseph's Corner

Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

In today's gospel Jesus draws on current events to comment on the general opinion of society. Two tragic events had taken place in Judea. Jesus explains that we should not look for the cause by judging the people who were victims, especially those who had died. But, rather, every event that takes place is a call to repentance. In a way, as a reminder, our lives are not our own. We do not choose when we live or when we die. Therefore, when tragedy takes place, we are called to be merciful, to come to the aid of those in need, and to reflect on our own actions and upon our own heart. This message couldn't be more apropos to the news-rich diet of modern society. Day to day our devices are full of all kinds of news. It leaves us sometimes in a way as to feel helpless or numb. Sometimes ill news brings the feeling of suspicion or conspiracy. In reality and truth, Jesus teaches us not to garner suspicion or believe conspiracy, but calls us to repent and to be merciful. St. Clement of Rome is famous for saying: "Going over all the stages of history again, we will see that in each era the Lord has given a chance to repent to anyone who wanted to convert to him." Jesus continues this theme with his parable of the barren fig tree. Without repentance we have no

hope of eternal life. Focusing on news, ill events, and the ill deeds of others brings the focus out of ourselves when in reality we should be looking at our own hearts and doing the work of repentance. This is an important distinction for spiritual maturity. This doesn't mean we do not hold others accountable, nor does it mean that we erase all boundaries. What it does mean is that instead of drawing unnecessary suspicion, gossip, and ill will, we should look in our own hearts for temptations to hatred of the other. We, as Christians, are called to something greater than the world has to offer us. We are called as Daughters and Sons of Almighty God! Let us live as his Children, blameless and innocent, sharing the cross with those who need help. Embracing our own crosses, and living a life of repentance so that we may bear fruit.



Fasting & Abstinence

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

A reflection on Lenten Fasting

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night), as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus; to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, his Resurrection.

Covid Restriction Changes

Covid restrictions have been lifted, We are going back to some practices we traditionally had before Covid hit.

For communion, we are welcome to form two lines in the center aisle to receive the Eucharist. If you are unable to do so, or you are uncomfortable doing so, a Eucharistic Minister will come around to you. Please remain standing to flag an Eucharistic Minister.

We are welcome to offer a handshake for the Sign of Peace. Please respect those who may not be comfortable with this gesture.
