Ramblings of the Pastor

A court-appointed attorney asked his new client about previous arrests and convictions. The client told him, with embarrassment, that there were many. The attorney then asked, "Any felonies?" Indignantly the man replied, "No way! I specialize in misdemeanors!" Do we see our sins as misdemeanors or felonies, as small or great? God doesn't! God sees sins as forgiven or not forgiven. As the story of the prodigal sons tells us, it matters not if our sins are great or small, but rather that we are seeking God's mercy. Even small sins can keep us from heaven if we don't realize our need for God's generous mercy. God can, and will, forgive our sins great and small when we admit our sinfulness, and ask for His pardon. This Lent, considers seeking His loving forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation.

This Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is called Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday. Rose vestments may be worn today as well as a few flowers on the altar because we have passed the halfway point of Lent. This little break in Lent represents the joy the Church has in anticipating the celebration of resurrection of Jesus on Easter. Anticipating that Easter joy, the readings today invite us to rejoice by being reconciled with God through repentance and confession of our sins. Rejoice in God's mercy!

Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

In what way are you reckless? Sometimes, we are reckless in sin, as the son was in today's gospel. Other times, we are reckless in love, as the father is in today's gospel. Other times, we are self-centered, skeptical, and lukewarm to both sin and love, as the brother was in today's gospel. We all have a choice to make. Yet, once we make that choice, we serve those intentions the rest of our lives, as our habits become formed. Never underestimate the power of a Father's love. Never underestimate the power of the love you have. So many times the mistake we make as parents, is one where we conflate love with control. That unless we are controlling our child, or someone we love, they will not love us in return or may even reject us. In the end, rejection may come no matter what. Even though our Heavenly Father was consistently rejected by Adam and Eve, he continually provided for them, nonetheless. Instead of seeking control, God sought their love and relationship. And for those who might retort that there must be consequences, who doesn't think Adam and Eve had enough consequence? For that matter, was there more than enough consequence for the prodigal son in today's parable? What is the purpose of a consequence? Is it not to experience a metanoia? A turning around from error or a life of ruin? The law of love allows for this freedom and this beckoning back to right relationship, because the world itself is created and built for this kind of reconciliation and relationship. We cannot escape the fact that we are called to be holy as our heavenly father is holy. Let us then pray for the grace to grow in the virtue of love, and to at least be reckless in one thing, which is love. Far better to make a mistake by love, than to sin by hatred.


Fasting & Abstinence

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

A reflection on Lenten Fasting

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night), as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus; to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, his Resurrection.
