Ramblings of the Pastor

There was a ruler who had suffered much from rebels, and pledged that every rebel should die. But one day, the rebels surrendered and begged for mercy. The ruler pardoned them all. A loyal minister said to the ruler, "Did you not say that every rebel should die?" "Yes", replied the ruler, "but I no longer see any rebels here." What do we see when someone says they are sorry? Today's gospel is the familiar story of the woman caught in adultery, and they ask Jesus if they should stone her. Jesus responds that the one without sin should throw the first stone. This story reminds us that God is ready to forgive and to restore people to His friendship. The readings challenge us to also show the mercy to others, and to live as forgiven people seeking reconciliation and being forgiving. The final words of this Gospel passage remind us that sin is never acceptable to God when Jesus says, "from now on do not sin anymore." This Lent, seek God's mercy in reconciliation and to share that grace with others.

To help us better appreciate the gift of the resurrection, the Church focus on the Passion of Christ for the last two weeks of Lent. If we wish to truly enjoy the gift of the resurrection, we must be willing to take up our cross and follow Jesus. We must be willing, as St Paul says, to share in His Passion. In these last two weeks of Lent, let us redouble our Lenten resolution, and focus on the passion of Jesus. By reflecting upon the passion, we can better appreciate the gifts of God in our lives and strengthen our faith in God.



Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

Today's gospel the question is asked, who is Jesus? Some believe he is the messiah, and some think he's a prophet. Some even think that Jesus is an ordinary man, or even a trickster. The most important question for us today isn't what others say Jesus is. The question that should prod our hearts is who do we say that Jesus is. Faith. Hope, and Love are the theological virtues, and each of these three require the free gift of God's grace. If you find yourself in short supply of any one of those three, pray for this gift to flower in your life. The reality is that Jesus loves all of us and that we are called to question our own hearts. Do we trust in him? Do we really believe he is who he says he is? Do we choose to take Jesus at his words when he gives us his body and blood, as described in John Chapter Six, and in actuality at the last supper? These are questions that should spark our hearts in favor of our Blessed Lord, and beckon us to live not only for ourselves, but for our neighbors. The Pharisees faltered because of their contempt for ordinary Jews who struggled to remain perfect in the law. Let our hearts not grow embittered by our judgement and similar contempt for those who struggle in practicing their faith. Speak words that will encourage others rather than harshen their reality. Give the grace of the benefit of the doubt. And by your faith, hope, and love, make a gift of yourself to others in a way that they too, will spark in their hearts the fruit of faith, hope, and love. The challenge is clear. We act in mercy and calmness, or we make a fool of ourselves holding everyone in contempt except oneself.

Fasting & Abstinence

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

A reflection on Lenten Fasting

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night), as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus; to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, his Resurrection.
