Ramblings of the Pastor

One day, Mother Teresa found a man lying in the gutter, very near death. He was filthy, dressed in little more than a rag and flies swarmed around his body. Immediately, Mother Teresa lovingly lifted him up, cleaned his body, spoke to him softly and laid him comfortably in her ambulance. A passerby was repulsed by the sight of the man and exclaimed to Mother Teresa, "I wouldn't do that for a million dollars." Her response was immediate, "Neither would I!" Money may be a motivator for many activities in our materialistic world. However, love can motivate people to do much more. Sacrificial love does not seek gain for self, but gain for others. St. Jerome relates that when Apostle John became old and couldn't preach very long, he would always say the words, "Little children, love one another." His disciples, wearied by the constant repetition, asked him why he always said this. "Because, it is the Lord's commandment," he replied, "and if it only be fulfilled, it is enough." Jesus spoke and did many things, but he was very clear about us needing to love others. Sacrificial love is the sign that we belong to Jesus. Loving others is the hardest part about being Christian, because the world tells us to take care of yourself first. Christ teaches that caring for the needs of others will satisfy our own needs. Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

In today's Gospel, Jesus implores his followers to remember the kind of love he shared with them, and thus to love all they meet with the same kind of love. In what way is God glorified? It is in the obedience of Jesus. Jesus redeems humanity not just at the Cross, which is the maximal moment of his gift to all humanity, but also at every moment and breath of his life. Jesus redeems humanity in the love he shares, in the moments he spent with his family, and in the moments he spent with the Apostles. Jesus redeems and glorifies God in the works he had done to heal and forgive sin. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that we are to glorify God in the same way, through obedience to the law of love. How can I be more loving to my family, to my neighbor? How can I give the benefit of the doubt? How can I encourage those I meet in the good, the beautiful, and the true? How can I be healing balm for those who need it, those who are outcasts, even to my enemies? These guestions, and more, lead us into the heart of the Gospel. Now we are in the age of the Holy Spirit. Love may be difficult, and so as a theological virtue it is ever more important that we pray for the grace to be more loving. Love itself is a gift, something that comes from the heart of God, it also is something we need to be able to accept. The beautiful thing about the Theological Virtues is that the heart of God inspires participation and imitation of his generosity. By our love, love is shared between souls, and thus with all those we meet. It's a gift that continues in abundance like a river overflowing the banks. May our love be inspired and founded by the Holy Spirit.
