

St. Joseph's Corner

Reflections of the Parish Life Coordinator

Jesus in this week's gospel tells us that if we truly love him we will keep his word. What does he mean by his word? Jesus speaks of the covenant that God makes with humanity through his son Jesus Christ. How do we renew our participation in Jesus' word or covenant? By receiving his most precious body and blood. In the early Church, they were very concerned about the advent of, or coming, of Christ. In fact, they used a word for this: Parusia. One thing many scholars overlook is the parusia, which the early Church refers to as the continual coming of Christ at the celebration of the Eucharist. Jesus comes to us each week, as well as at the weekday Masses. Will we keep his covenant? By participating in the sacred table, we are therefore strengthened in living out the commandments and to even more importantly become a source of blessing and sacrament for those we encounter in the world, who otherwise would not have contact with the sacraments. So critical is this mission that Jesus last words to his disciples were to be sacrament for all the world, "Baptizing in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit." Jesus calls us to participate in the mystery of his life. It is not enough to simply believe, but to be called and enter into salvation history, working for the common good of all of humanity; journeying together towards the end of time. We glorify him in loving him and his commands, in being Christ for others, and in sacrificing for the good of the community. Love is lived out for others, particularly for Christ, because it is love which is magnified in our own hearts, and in the hearts of those who we encounter. Be Christ today for others, be sacrament to the world as you are strengthened by Christ's own body and continual coming. Keep his word, be alive in the Spirit, and live!
