

CATHOLICISM AND THE 4TH OF JULY

Fireworks. Baseball games. Picnics. This is what the 4th of July means to most Americans today. But July 4th, 1776, was a very solemn day for the fifty-five men who affixed their signatures to the Declaration of Independence. For in so doing, every man who signed the Declaration had something to lose. In putting their name to the document, they committed treason. If their bid for independence went wrong, everything they had—their property, their livelihoods, their freedomwould disappear.

A relatively small number of Catholics did successfully settle in what would later become the eastern United States, most notably in Maryland, which was established by the efforts of the Catholic Calvert family under King Charles I in 1633. By that time, religious liberty had come a long way in the new United States of America. Though established and governed by Catholics initially, Maryland's history, like that of the rest of what would become the United States, would be filled with growing pains regarding the establishment of religious freedom. By 1708, there were 3,000 Catholics in Maryland – a small one-tenth of the population – and they had seen major setbacks. Anglicanism had been established in the colony in 1702, requiring taxes and compulsory attendance, while Catholics could not vote or hold public office. Ten years later their right to worship privately was reinstated, but it would be a long road to religious liberty for the Catholics of Maryland and the American colonies. However, the seeds had been planted for the future.

Charles Carroll (born 1737) of Carrollton, Maryland was the only son of Maryland's richest planter, a cousin to the future Archbishop John Carroll (first bishop and Archbishop in the United States) and was one of the wealthiest men in America at the time. When it came to revolution, fortune or no, he was all in. After spending sixteen years studying in France and London, he began advocating for independence soon after he returned to

Annapolis in 1765. In the pages of the Maryland Gazette and in other correspondence, he supported American self-governance and denounced British taxation policies. By the early 1770's, Carroll anticipated armed conflict, telling his friend Samuel Chase that it would ultimately require "the bayonet" to resolve the colonies' dispute with the British. "Our arguments will only raise the feelings of the people to that pitch, when open war will be looked to as the arbiter of the dispute," he predicted.

In 1776, Carroll became one of Maryland's delegates to the Continental Congress. Although he was not present to vote on Jefferson's Declaration, he signed it gladly and proudly after the Congress passed it on July 4, 1776, giving the document its lone Catholic signature. In later years, Carroll served as both a state and a U.S. senator, advocated (unsuccessfully) for the gradual abolition of slavery in Maryland, and sought to resettle former slaves in Liberia. When he died on November 14, 1832, he was the last surviving signer of the Declaration of Independence—an act that, in the end, cost him little and gained him much.

As we Americans celebrate the independence of our country, we have a lot to be thankful for. A look back at the history of our nation cannot help but give us a better appreciation for the freedoms that we may take for granted each year as we put out our American flags and deck out our homes in red, white, and blue for the 4th of July. This holiday gives us time to thank God for the birth of our nation, give thanks for gift of life and petition God to preserve our country. In man's aspirations for freedom, there is always a spiritual element, and this was especially true in the thinking of the American signers of the Declaration of Independence at Philadelphia. Let us remember to give thanks to God for them and for our opportunity to worship openly and freely as a faith community.


