

#### "WE THREE KINGS"

Today, we sing the theme song of the Epiphany: "We Three Kings of Orient Are." Although this song has become a classic "must-sing" on this day, did you know the lyrics contain several discrepancies with today's Gospel? According to Matthew 2:1-12: "magi from the east arrived in

Jerusalem," which does not exactly translate to "three kings from the Orient" as the song would lead you to believe. Though Western tradition seems to have added some unconfirmed details, the important details lie in the three gifts they brought and their symbolism. They brought gold, a gift for a king, frankincense to honor him as the son of God, and myrrh foreshadowing his eventual death. Together, they honor the Child, a gift from the God whose love is beyond our comprehension. We are called to do the same; like the magi, we must seek and find God in our daily lives, and honor him with our own unique gifts. #### **EPIPHANY OF THE LORD (JANUARY 2)**

The Solemnity of the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ is one of the oldest Christian feasts, though, throughout the centuries, it has celebrated a variety of things. Epiphany comes from a Greek verb meaning "to reveal," and all the various events celebrated by the Feast of the Epiphany are revelations of Christ to man. Like many of the most ancient Christian feasts, Epiphany was first celebrated in the East, where it has been held from the beginning almost universally on January 6. Today, among both Eastern Catholics and Eastern Orthodox, the feast is known as Theophany—the revelation of God to man.

Epiphany originally celebrated four different events, in the following order of importance: the Baptism of the Lord; Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana; the Nativity of Christ; and the visitation of the Wise Men or Magi. Each of these is a revelation of God to man: At Christ's Baptism, the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of God the Father is heard, declaring that Jesus is His Son; at the wedding in Cana, the miracle reveals Christ's divinity; at the Nativity, the angels bear witness to Christ, and the shepherds, representing the people of Israel, bow down before Him; and in the visitation of the Magi, representatives of neighboring pagan religions, the good news of salvation and Christ's divinity is revealed to the Gentiles—the other nations of the earth.

Eventually, the celebration of the Nativity was separated out, in the West, into Christmas; and shortly thereafter, Western Christians adopted the Eastern feast of the Epiphany, still celebrating the Baptism, the first miracle, and the visit from the Wise Men. Thus, Epiphany

came to mark the end of Christmastide — the Twelve Days of Christmas, which began with the revelation of Christ to Israel in His birth and ended with the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles at Epiphany. Over the centuries, the various celebrations were further separated in the West, and now the Baptism of the Lord is celebrated on the Sunday after January 6, and the wedding at Cana is commemorated on the Sunday after the Baptism of the Lord. In many parts of Europe, the celebration of Epiphany is at least as important as the celebration of Christmas. In Italy and other Mediterranean countries, Christian's exchange gifts on Epiphany—the day on which the Wise Men brought their gifts to the Christ Child—while in Northern Europe, it's not unusual to give gifts on both Christmas and Epiphany (often with smaller gifts on each of the twelve days of Christmas in between).

It is traditional for parish priests to bless chalk for each family so that they may mark the names of the three Magi over their doors and blessing their homes as a witness of their faith and protection against evil. The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2022 — is simple: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20+C+M+B+22. The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "22" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

#### **NEW MEMBERS**

Adults who are 21 years and older are encouraged to register as members of the parish. Church attendance alone does not make you or your family registered members.

Parish membership is required for Baptism, First Reconciliation\First Communion preparation, Christian formation enrollment, Confirmation and Marriage. Please call the Parish Office to make an appointment.

#### **BAPTISM**

Baptism requires preparation of the parents and should be completed <u>early</u> in your pregnancy or adoption process. Please call the Parish Office to register for the next class and upcoming available Baptism dates.

#### **MARRIAGE**

Engaged couples, planning on getting married through St Leonard parish, need to meet with the priest at least 6 months in advance. Please note that no date can be finalized for the wedding until after this initial meeting takes place. At least one of the couple must be a registered member of the parish. Please call the Parish Office to make an appointment.

#### MINISTRY TO SICK & SHUT-INS

If you are confined at home and unable to attend Mass, to receive Communion please call the parish office for a visit from the Pastoral Associate. The extended care facilities in our area are gradually reopening and our nursing home ministers are resuming Communion services per facility direction. Because of federal privacy laws, if you wish a visit from the priest or Pastoral Associate while in the hospital, you or your family must call the parish and inform us that you are a patient and request a visit.
