

This weekend we conclude the Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The public ministry of Jesus commences when he is baptized by John in the Jordan River. The Feast of Jesus' Baptism is thus a fitting transition from the Christmas Season back to Ordinary Time.

During the Christmas season I find myself reflecting on the fact

During the Christmas season I find myself reflecting on the fact that Jesus was a baby who cried and fussed – and then a toddler

who made messes – and then a child who asked lots of questions – and then a teenager struggling to find his way. His humanity needed to grow and develop just like all of us.

I think about that when I see babies and children at Mass. We are so blessed at St. Leonard to have so many young people! The Church is a big family and big families need people of all ages to be present and active.

When you see parents of young children at Mass, please make them feel welcome. It was Jesus himself who said, "let the children come to me; do not prevent them. For the kingdom of God belongs to such as these" (Mark 10:13-14). Jesus wants babies and children to be at Mass!

On this Feast of Jesus' Baptism, it is also fitting to reflect a bit on our own baptism. In baptism we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, we become children of God, and we are filled with sanctifying grace to live out the vocation that God has made us for. Being baptized implies having a mission – to share God's goodness, truth, and beauty with others.

Spend some time this week praying and asking God how you're called to live out your faith in a deeper way in this New Year. And then make it your resolution to act on that inspiration from the Lord.

#### "I HAVE LOVED YOU"

Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks not only the end of the Christmas season, but the beginning of Jesus's public ministry. We hear from Luke's Gospel today that after Jesus is baptized, the heavens were opened and

"the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." This event bears much significance to us today because it resembles our own baptism. Just as Jesus reemerged from the Jordan River as the "beloved Son," we too were washed of our sins and reborn as beloved children of God when we were baptized. We sing "I Have Loved You" today recalling words from the prophet Isaiah that remind us that God has loved us with an "everlasting love" and that he has called us and we are His beloved sons and daughters. Just as Jesus's baptism marked the beginning of His public ministry, our own baptism configures us to Jesus and marks us ready to go forth and follow in the footsteps of Jesus to love and serve others. On this great feast day, let us call to mind our own baptism and renew our commission to spread God's love to the world.

2022 WOMEN'S RETREAT ~ BLOOM WHERE YOU ARE PLANTED

The past almost two years certainly have not been what most of us imagined it would be. COVID-19 has rapidly affected our day-to-day life and businesses, disrupted world trade, and limited our movements. Having to physically distance from someone you love—like friends, family, coworkers, or your worship community—has been hard. The pandemic may also have caused changes in plans—for instance, conducting virtual job interviews or working from home, virtual home classrooms with our children, and cancelling vacation plans or other travel. We all have struggled adapting to new social routines—from choosing to skip in person gatherings to consistently wearing masks in public.

The theme for our 2022 Annual Women's Retreat—Bloom Where You Are Planted while in a bit of a different format from past retreats, will strive to help us focus on adapting to these challenges through the lens of faith. The expression "bloom where you are planted" means a person should take advantage of the opportunities they have in their life and be grateful for the present situation. Often, if you're unhappy with where you're at in life, you may struggle with this notion. However, there are many things you can do to thrive even in circumstances that are not ideal. We may not be where we thought we should or would be, with the people we thought we should or could be with, or in the situations we thought we should,

could, or would someday be in, but if we focus on Jesus then we need to trust that He has us right where He needs and wants us. As we reflect on the things that do not go according to our plans, it's important to embrace the thorns or the difficult parts and choose to bloom anyway. There are times to bloom where we are planted, and times for us to be transplanted so we can bloom even better elsewhere.

The 2022 retreat will be held at the Schoenstatt Retreat Center in Waukesha and will focus on reflecting on who we are as women in this very time and place. Spring is a time of new beginnings as we strive to bloom wherever He plants us. Are you blooming where you are planted? Filled with the anticipatory joy of Easter, we will recommit ourselves to His call to Bloom Where You Are Planted!
