# SAINT BLAISE AND THE BLESSING OF THROATS

February 3rd is celebrated as the Optional Memorial of St. Blaise. We will offer the traditional Blessing of Throats immediately after all Masses next weekend on January 29-30.

After the closing song, you may come up to the one of the ministers holding blessed candles. The minister will hold the candles over your throat and say the blessing prayer.

St. Blaise is someone deeply rooted in popular piety. He was a bishop in Armenia during the 4th century. He was martyred in 316 AD, during the persecutions of the Roman Emperor Diocletian.

According to tradition, St. Blaise had been arrested and put in a dungeon for being a Christian. He was brought food and candles by a pious woman who felt sorry for him. One day, she brought him her son who had a fish bone stuck in his throat. St. Blaise prayed over the boy and he coughed up the fish bone. Ever since, St. Blaise became associated with the healing of throats.

Here is the traditional blessing on St. Blaise Day:

"Through the intercession of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat, and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

## "LORD, YOU HAVE THE WORDS"

Today's first reading tells of the priest-scribe Ezra reading to the Israelite people from the book of the law of God

sometime after their return from the Babylonian exile. Upon hearing the laws proclaimed, the people began to weep, but Ezra tells them, "Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!" In today's world, rules and laws can often be a source of anxiety and frustration, but we are reminded that the laws of God are meant to free us from our own selfish desires and lead us closer to God. We hear this same idea echoed in Psalm 19 today. We hear the lines, "The law of the Lord is perfect, refreshing the soul" and "The precepts of the Lord are right, they gladden the heart." To the psalmist, the law of God is not a restriction, but instead the source of wisdom that empowers and liberates those who adhere to live lives of meaning and purpose. As Psalm 19 says, God's laws should gladden our hearts not only because they are fair and just, but also because they are our roadmap to happiness with Him. This week, take a few minutes and ask yourself: do I joyfully embrace the Law of the Lord, so as to be a better follower of Christ?

## **EZRA: REPAIRING POST-EXILE WORSHIP**

Our first reading this weekend is from the Book of Nehemiah and tells of Ezra, a priest and "a scribe skilled in the law", who read to the people of Jerusalem from the book of the Law of Moses. A bit of background can help us understand this reading. Though Ezra is not one of the more widely known figures in the Bible, he played a vital role in the spiritual health of the Jewish people. Ezra, whose name means "help," was a descendent of Aaron, the chief priest under Moses, and was related to Joshua, who became the High Priest of the rebuilt Temple after the Babylonian Exile. Ezra spent his life as a priest, serving the Israelites both during their exile in Babylon and as they returned to Jerusalem. And his religious leadership helped generate a revival among the Jews as they resettled.

Ezra represented the position of stricter Babylonian Jews who had been upset by reports of permissiveness in Judah and desired to see matters corrected. Called "the father of Judaism" or "the second Moses" by some, Ezra was passionate about God's Law. It was the foundation of his own life, and he used the Torah (which later became the first five books of the Old Testament) to remind others how to live righteously. In about 538 BC, King Cyrus of Persia proclaimed that God's Temple in Jerusalem was to be rebuilt. The first group of volunteers left Babylon, led by Zerubbabel. They met with opposition from political enemies, but eventually, after about ten years, the project resumed, and the Temple was finally completed in about 516 BC. Ezra was the second of three key leaders to leave Babylon with volunteers for the reconstruction of Jerusalem, sent with religious and political powers by the Persian King Artaxerxes. While Zerubbabel had reconstructed the temple, and Nehemiah would rebuild the walls, Ezra soon realized that the worship life of the returning exiles needed repairing. He condemned mixed marriages and

encouraged Jews to divorce and banish their foreign wives. He renewed the celebration of festivals and supported the rededication of the Temple and the rebuilding of the Jerusalem wall. He desired a molding of the community in accordance with the Torah and his impeccable priestly and scribal credentials allowed him to remain the model leader. In our first reading, as all the people gathered in the square in front of the Water Gate of Jerusalem, they called upon Ezra to bring forth the book of the law of Moses which the Lord had commanded for Israel. Thirteen men are named specifically; it has been suggested they are listed partly to declare their consent and agreement with Ezra in what he said and did; and partly that they, or some of them, might have had a role in the important duty of publicly reading and clarifying the Scripture in the Temple. Our reading takes place on the first day of what became known as the Feast of Booths, and Ezra read from the book of the law of Moses, day after day, from the first day to the last of the seven-day feast, ending with a solemn assembly on the eighth day as was required.

The combined work of Ezra and Nehemiah is our most important literary source for the formation of the Jewish religious community in Judah after the Babylonian exile, and these two men were most responsible for the reorganization of Jewish life during this period of time. In addition to being a priest and a scribe, Ezra was also a prolific writer. In addition to the book in the bible that bears his name, he contributed to both 1 and 2 Chronicles, as well as to the book of Nehemiah. Traditionally Judaism credits Ezra with establishing the Great Assembly of scholars and prophets, the forerunner of the Sanhedrin, as the authority on matters of religious law. As for the end of his life, some scholars hold that Ezra was buried in Jerusalem, but others claim his body was returned to Babylonia and buried there.

Baptism requires preparation of the parents and should be completed <u>early</u> in your pregnancy or adoption process. Please call the Parish Office to register for the next class and upcoming available Baptism dates.

Engaged couples, planning on getting married through St Leonard parish, need to meet with the priest at least 6 months in advance. Please note that no date can be finalized for the wedding until after this initial meeting takes place. At least one of the couple must be a registered member of the parish. Please call the Parish Office to make an appointment.

If you are confined at home and unable to attend Mass, to receive Communion please call the parish office for a visit from the Pastoral Associate. The extended care facilities in our area are gradually reopening and our nursing home ministers are resuming Communion services per facility direction. Because of federal privacy laws, if you wish a visit from the priest or Pastoral Associate while in the hospital, you or your family must call the parish and inform us that you are a patient and request a visit.


