MITCH'S MESSAGE



I hate running. I remember when I was in the military, I was always barely passing my running test. But there was a time when I ran every day for a year. I remember the moment when I felt like I couldn't run any more when all of a sudden, I caught a "second wind," something I had heard runners get. Immediately, I was filled with so much energy, and instead of walking to catch my breath, I could just slow jog and it would feel like I was walking.

In our lives, we have all had that feeling, know someone who is feeling that right now, or maybe that's how you feel today; that feeling that you can't "run" anymore, like you want to throw in the towel, that your brokenness defines you and there's nothing you can do about it, or that your marriage or your relationship with your kids won't get better. The good news is that you were not created for all of this. You were "*fearfully and wonderfully made*," and the Living God who loves you has fashioned you to share in His joy, His peace, and His love. (*Psalms 139:14*) He understands that feeling like you're "running out of breath" because He took His last breath on the Cross for us. Take heart, our God is ALIVE brothers and sisters. He is alive and He is *moving*. He's ready to give you that second, third, fourth, and fifth "wind."

The question is, are you ready for the transformation He offers?

The Holy Spirit moves where He wills, but He can't move what refuses to be moved. The gift of our free will was given to us so that we can choose to give Him our hearts. It's when we give Him our hearts that we experience healing and restoration.

I felt lost a couple years ago, under a mountain of debt, couldn't hold a job, stuck in my pride and sin, and I felt like my world was spiraling down. It was during this feeling of hopelessness that I returned to Christ, especially in His presence in the Eucharist during Adoration. Every day in prayer, He reassured me of His love for me and His plan for me. He had been patiently waiting for me to turn to Him for purpose and for peace, both in good times *and* in bad.

Brothers and sisters, our God that created you has an *overabundance* of mercy waiting to shower upon you. His love and kindness is immeasurable. He wants you. He desires your heart.

It can be scary to surrender to something outside of yourself, but I can tell you by personal experience: **it is freeing**. When you know you have a perfect Father in heaven that loves you, you have *nothing* to fear.

Where's a good place to restart? Rediscover the beautiful Sacrament of Reconciliation. The confessional is like a "sauna" of mercy. You're only in there for a few minutes, but you come out cleansed, refreshed, and renewed.

Last weekend, Fr. Jim emphasized a prayer during Mass that reminded us ***that you and I were created to share in God's divine life***. This is the life we lost at the fall with Adam and Eve, but it's the life that is offered to us everyday in the Sacraments. New life, new relationships, new purpose, and new mercies are being freely offered to you right here, right now. Trust in Him, take the leap, and let Him in.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.





GOLDEN JUBILEE OF ORDINATION



The SJV Book Discussion group will meet **Monday, June 7**, at **1:00pm** to discuss the book **Caste** by Isabel Wilkerson. The author is a Pulitzer prize winner and this book has received many awards for its frank discussion of race and the hidden caste system in America.



In this brilliant book, Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America as she explores, through an immersive, deeply researched narrative and stories about real people, how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings. Beyond race, class, or other factors, there is a powerful caste system that influences people's lives and behavior and the nation's fate. She writes about the surprising health costs of caste, in depression and life expectancy, and the effects of this hierarchy on our culture and politics. Finally, she points forward to ways America can move beyond the artificial and destructive separations of human divisions, toward hope in our common humanity.



WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY IS JUNE 5

Since 2009, the United States has lost 33 million acres of grassland and wildflower habitats in the Great Plains. That's only three million acres less than the entire area of Iowa! As we recognize **World Environment Day** on June 5, let's celebrate by planting wildflowers in our backyards or in pots on the patio or deck. Even one square foot can supply food for bees, butterflies, or hummingbirds. Try to choose plants that will bloom throughout the season and are native to our Great Plains area. Native plants are good for the environment because they require less water and help prevent erosion. Less fertilizer and pesticides are used in native gardens compared to lawns, and they decrease pollution because less mowing is required. The deep root systems in native plants help the soil store water. Native plants provide beneficial habitat for birds and other wildlife.
