HEALTH MINISTRY MUSINGS



As we look back on the past year, we may ask ourselves how we could have possibly made it through. What a year! And it's not over yet. We are called to be resilient.

What is *resilience*? It is the ability to meet, learn from and not be crushed by the challenges and stresses of life. Resilience is the strength and speed of our response to adversity, the process of adapting well amidst trauma, tragedy, or significant sources of stress. Resilience is the capacity of the human spirit to persevere and grow and find deeper meaning in the experiences of life.

The seeds of resilience are planted in the ways we process negative events and experiences. Although challenging, trauma itself doesn't make someone less resilient; instead, resilience can be learned and developed over time with learning proper resilience-building skills.

Our faith reminds us that suffering, although hard to understand at times, can be the greatest path to understanding the undeserved and glorious treasure of the gospel. So, rather than viewing suffering as an inconvenient, unfair punishment, it becomes important to see it through the lens of the gospels. Suffering reveals our weaknesses, and we are encouraged to turn to God. This turning to God through prayer and faith-filled understanding of our tribulations can build resilience, also.

At first glance, pain and suffering seem to do nothing more than cause us pain and rob us of joy and happiness. But in time, God often uses it to increase and deepen our joy and freedom in Him as it drives us to Christ and lifts our eyes heavenward.

Like building a muscle, increasing resilience takes time and intentionality, focusing on four core components: connection, wellness, healthy thinking, and meaning. These can empower one to withstand and learn from difficult and traumatic experiences.

Everyone has a need to connect with others. Having a connection with trustworthy and compassionate individuals who validate our feelings and support the skill of resilience is important. Trauma tends to lead people to isolate. This past year has called us to be more creative in how we protect ourselves and our loved ones, and still interact with others. Connecting by electronic means, having visits through windows, or in-person, socially distanced, are alternative options.

Prayer, meditation, and going back to church help build and renew connections as well as restore hope, as does helping others. Reaching out to help others increases mastery and self-worth and increases our resilience. Meeting goals and accomplishing tasks also move us toward healing. Rediscovering potential, keep things in perspective and accept change, recognizing God is in control are attitudes that move us toward health and healing. Challenging thinking, maintaining a healthy outlook, focusing on goals and achievements rather than on fears, and recognizing past behaviors and attitudes that were helpful in previous times of distress, help us discover how to respond today.

Even with the best intentions and thoughts, there are times we need to seek the help of others. It can be a friend or a professional. Getting help when you need it is critical to building resilience!

During the past year many believe God is using this time to draw all peoples closer. Praying more, reading His Word, attending church in person when possible, and spending time with others can be godly moments. Be thankful for what we have, not what we don't have. While times have been difficult there is always reason for hope. God is our hope and our ever-present help in danger, both in good times and in bad. Keep praying and hold on to the hope and promises the Lord has given us.



St. John Vianney Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes – May 11, 2021 (Zoom)

PRESENT:

INTRODUCTION OF NEW PASTOR (Fr. Jim) Fr. Jim introduced Fr. Rich to the council and each member provided him with an overview of their history, leadership roles, and involvement in our parish ministries.

OPENING PRAYER (Fr. Jim) Fr. Jim led all present in an opening prayer.

APPROVAL OF MARCH 9, 2021, MINUTES (Deb Sullivan) The minutes were sent in advance and no changes were requested. Ann Fischer motioned to approve, several members seconded, and the minutes were approved as written.

MEETING AGENDA REVIEW (Deb Sullivan) The agenda was sent in advance. A report on the Parish Priority Planning (PPP) initiative by Dennis Gerard was added, and the updated agenda was approved.

BETTENDORF CATHOLIC STUDY UPDATE (Fr. Jim & Dennis Gerard) A small committee is being formed to provide ongoing updates. Currently there is no new information. Work will be done over the next few months towards a master plan, feasibility study, and detailed explanation of the project phases.

PROJECT UPDATES (Fr. Jim) Russell Construction and Jim Giese Commercial Roofing have started repairing the church roof, which should be completed in by early June. They will also replace the hail-damaged roof on the rectory. In parallel, handrails are being added for the Blessed Sacrament Chapel and the Mary (daily Mass) Chapel. This construction should not affect weekend activities.

SJV PRESCHOOL STAFFING (Fr. Jim) We are still reviewing resumes, seeking the perfect candidate for the hybrid administrator/teacher position and the two class aide positions. Interviews will start soon. There are backup staffing options that may be considered based on the applicant pool's qualifications.

COMMITTEE / STAFF REPORTS (Deb Sullivan) Committee reports were sent in advance and were accepted as submitted. Religious Education is creating videos of religious stories and volunteer readers would be welcomed.

PARISH COUNCIL NOMINATION (Bob Baldes): Thanks go out to everyone for their help with this process. The names of potential council members and a talk sheet has been distributed to the council to talk with the candidates and finalize the list of names for the upcoming selection at the Pentecost Mass on May 22. Fr. Jim will select three regular and one alternate council members. It is hoped that those not selected will participate as commission team members.

COMMISSION / COMMITTEE ROSTER UPDATE (Deb Sullivan): Updates are still being made to the Commission Chart, which will become an addendum to the online constitution. Hopefully, the commissions will become fully active again very quickly. Thanks to coordinators of the Sacrament of First Communion, which was very well run.

PASTOR REPORT (Fr. Jim) Fr. Jim has very much enjoyed his time at our parish, where he has been blessed with guidance and support from everyone. Many thanks go out to those people whose appointments to the parish council end in July for their hard work and service to the parish. The council wishes Fr. Jim the best in retirement and encourages everyone to come to his farewell celebration on the weekend of June 12/13.



GOLDEN JUBILEE OF ORDINATION




SJV BOOK DISCUSSION

The SJV Book Discussion group will meet **Monday, June 7, at 1:00pm** to discuss the book **Caste** by Isabel Wilkerson. The author is a Pulitzer prize winner and this book has received many awards for its frank discussion of race and the hidden caste system in America.



In this brilliant book, Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America as she explores, through an immersive, deeply researched narrative and stories about real people, how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings. Beyond race, class, or other factors, there is a powerful caste system that influences people's lives and behavior and the nation's fate. She writes about the surprising health costs of caste, in depression and life expectancy, and the effects of this hierarchy on our culture and politics. Finally, she points forward to ways America can move beyond the artificial and destructive separations of human divisions, toward hope in our common humanity.


