

JUDY'S JOYFULLNESS



My favorite flowers have started blooming this week. These bright, mustard-yellow “Missouri” or “evening” primroses bring joy and delight as I arise each morning and see their beauty. Why do I love them so? Their cheerful yellow color and bounteous blooms certainly lift my spirits, but also the fact that they’ve grown and spread widely from just a few seeds to cover multiple large, lush swaths of our garden. We, in turn, have shared these small seeds with friends and neighbors. Multiplying seeds and plants are a gardener’s delight, especially when one can share them with others.

This weekend’s gospel speaks of the parable of the mustard seed ... small, but with tremendous potential for growth. So often in our society we think that powerful or important people can make a difference, but in the Kingdom of God, anyone can make a difference and our smallest acts have unlimited potential. Sometimes it’s not how tall or big our mustard seed grows, but the ripple effects from our small, simple, holy acts.

I recently attended a Jewish baby-naming/blessing ceremony. The rabbi spoke that, coincidentally, this was being held at the time of the “new moon.” She spoke of it not being the time of the “full moon” with its obvious bigness and brightness, but the “new moon” where it’s dark and we must trust in its potential for light. She compared it to the new baby, barely more than a seed or small plant, but filled with so much potential for growth and goodness that it compels us to trust God in all that is hidden but which will grow with attention, action, nurturing, love, and grace.

We celebrate Fr. Jim’s retirement this weekend. Even though he might not have taught us in parables like Jesus, he certainly has taught us much and helped to nurture and grow this corner of the Kingdom here in Bettendorf and around the diocese. And just like seeds that have potential and may take a long time to see growth, he has planted seeds of faith, hope, love, holiness, truth, kindness, and justice that will spread far and wide. He has taught us and formed us through homilies, liturgy, articles, RCIA, music, meetings, ministry, and myriads of one-on-one interactions. Leadership, pastoral care, commitments of time and money to those struggling in our community, courage to speak up on issues and injustices, problem solving, collegiality, and servant leadership have been hallmarks of his lifelong ministry.

I heard a follow-up story from the many phone calls made by our parishioners to check on each other during the pandemic. Someone had struggled greatly with employment, finances, schooling their children, etc. A short phone call from a parishioner who had responded to Fr. Jim’s “tap-tap-tap” led to hope, encouragement, and a connection to helpful resources to aid that struggling parishioner who is now thriving.

As we continue to hear and respond to Fr Jim’s famous words to attune to the “tap-tap-tap” of the Holy Spirit, calling us to life and our role in the building the Kingdom of God, may we trust in the potential of the small or unseen. God’s blessings on your well-earned retirement, Fr Jim!





- *Large appliances – please contact Ken Miller to inquire.*



AND as all of us have been or will be blessed by the priests of SJV, let us celebrate their ordination anniversaries in prayer and acknowledgement.



WEDNESDAY MORNING BOOK DISCUSSION

The Cup of Our Life ~ A Guide to Spiritual Growth by Sr. Joyce Rupp




Whether you like your morning cup(s) of coffee or tea or your afternoon lemonade or refreshing adult beverage, *The Cup of Our Life: A Guide to Spiritual Growth* can be savored in small doses for prayer and reflection. Join with us as we reconnect with each other, catch up on what's been going on each other's lives, and enrich our relationship with God.

We have already had our first session, but it is not too late to join us on **Wednesdays: June 16, 23, 30, July 7, 14, 21** from **9:30-11:00am**. These sessions will be in-person—with COVID-19 precautions—and via Zoom.

The Cup of Our Life is a six-week daily devotional that uses the metaphor of a cup to connect us with God. The Cup of Life: Each one of us is a temple of the Holy One. Each of us carries a spiritual power in us that can cause even the tiniest of faith seeds to grow. It is vital that we protect and nurture this relationship so that it thrives. The cup of our spiritual life must be cared for and replenished as it pours its contents away in loving service. The Open Cup: Almost everything needs to be opened to serve its purpose. Being open is a prerequisite for spiritual growth. For God to enter our lives fully, we must be ready to receive. The Chipped Cup: Flaws and inadequacies come with the territory of being human. Imperfections remind us of how much we need God and give us opportunity for growth and change. The Broken Cup: When the cup of our lives is broken apart, it has to have the pieces put back together again. Our brokenness can be an instrument for change. The Cup of Compassion: Each life influences and affects others in some way. The more we see our world as a vast interconnectedness of all beings, the more drawn we will be to compassion because we will see how much one life is related to and affected by another. This spiritual oneness is at the heart of Christianity. Christ is the vine, and we are the branches. The Blessing Cup: The cup of blessing is a term derived from the Jewish Passover rite, meaning not only that the cup is blessed, but also that the cup itself holds a blessing. It holds the gift of life.

We are appreciative to the many parishioners, friends, Men's Fellowship members, and Knights of Columbus who have made bike and monetary donations. Through the efforts of Bill and Judy Benevento, Tom Gizicki, and Dan Schlader, we have assisted in delivering over 100 bikes to low income and homeless

individuals. The gratitude shown by these recipients truly outweighs our efforts. Healthy Habits continues to provide discounted rates on bike parts and now, the Bettendorf Police Department is providing bikes through their unclaimed bikes program. A YEAR OF THE PANDEMIC

As members of your Health Ministry Team, we'd like to take this opportunity to share facts and myths about the virus and vaccine. We recognize all of us must make decisions about our health and wellness and we do not all approach the topic with the same information and history. We are fatigued and frustrated with the restrictions that have been recommended, but we believe it is helpful to return to basics and remind ourselves what we need to do and why.



We can reduce our risk of disease with a few simple strategies:

- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect yourself and others if you have not yet been fully vaccinated. *(Many may still wish to continue masking in public places.)*
- Stay six feet apart from others who don't live with you.
- Get a COVID-19 vaccine when it is available to you.
- Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water aren't available.

While there are several myths and concerns traveling around, overall the vaccines are deemed to be safe and effective in preventing COVID-19 and especially severe illness. Those include:

- COVID-19 vaccines do not change or interact with your DNA in any way.
- You will not become ill with COVID-19 after receiving a vaccine.
- After receiving a COVID-19 vaccine, you will not test positive for COVID-19 on a viral test.
- There are currently no safety concerns with fertility or if pregnant when receiving the vaccine.

If you have not yet received the vaccine, we encourage you to do so. If you have any concerns or questions, call us or your health care provider. Your health ministers are available to answer questions and assist in any way we can to help you achieve wellness.
