


PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



A little better than two months here at SJV I'm still wrapping my head around the many activities, people, and traditions of this community. I have to admit my anxiety this past weekend introducing the change of kneeling after the Lamb of God and continue kneeling after receiving this most Holy Eucharistic Bread. Anytime any change is brought into anyone's life, especially church life, there can be an expectant discourse with those who disagree. This was not the case as there were overwhelming comments of appreciation and approval. The whole of our Catholic faith is based around the Eucharist, the source and the summit of all we believe. Kneeling in adoration of the presence of our Lord and in thanksgiving after receiving this awesome gift seems more appropriate than earlier practice. I thank you for your support.

It's all about knowing why we do the things we do, right? As I mentioned in my homily last weekend, every move and gesture expressed in the liturgy has its purpose and meaning. The more you know and become aware of the Mass, the more beautiful and awesome our faith and the Mass celebration becomes! I've often used the analogy of a football game—if you know nothing about football, the players, and how it's played, football is boring. The same with the Mass. But, the more you know ... well, to KNOW our faith is to LOVE it, in loving it—you'll LIVE it, and in living it—you'll SHARE it. That's one of my teaching mantras and isn't that really what Jesus wants and expects us to do?

So, how do we learn about our faith? Our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program starts this Sunday. This class isn't just for anyone interested in becoming Catholic, but also a wonderful opportunity for anyone to come, listen, and learn more about this awesome faith we have. Even the "cradle Catholic" sponsors who have walked through the program are always amazed at how much they've taken for granted in their faith and how much more meaningful their faith became after being in this class. But, there are also bible studies, book clubs, and more opportunities in this parish that are readily available to help in this knowledge and growing in our relationships with God and one another!



A special recognition for all of our religious education teachers beginning classes this Wednesday. This weekend, Mother Church celebrates Catechetical Sunday, which is an opportunity for ALL Catholics to rededicate themselves to the mission of handing on our faith and being witness to the Gospel as a community of faith. We pray for all parents—who are the first and most important teachers of their children in passing on the faith—but also to the many dedicated teachers giving of their time and sharing their treasures with our youth!



What is an Antiphon?

For the past few weeks, you heard some of the antiphons being sung. At SJV, we are embarking upon a mission of learning the antiphons of the Mass. What is an antiphon, you might ask?

An antiphon is a verse of scripture that is prescribed to be sung at each Mass throughout the liturgical year. If you use a daily prayer book such as *The Word Among Us* or *Give Us This Day*, you may have noticed these scripture verses listed as "Entrance Antiphon" and "Communion Antiphon." The antiphons originated from the worship of the Jewish people and were adopted into Christian worship in the early church. They are designed to complement the lectionary readings for each day. Why haven't we sung the antiphons at SJV, you might ask?

Until recently, our resources for the antiphons consisted mainly of chant. This musical style can be difficult for the modern ear to catch on to, unless you are a trained musician. With the goal of having fully conscious and active participation by the faithful at Mass (which is central to Mother Church—see *Sacrosanctum Concilium* 14) it has been a common choice by most churches to use a hymn in a more modern musical style, rather than the chant antiphon. However, the primary choice according to our instructions on how to celebrate Mass has always been to sing the antiphons (see *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 48).

Good news! We have a newly-published resource called *Let Us All Rejoice! Modern Musical Settings of the Entrance and Communion Antiphons*. Over the next several weeks, you will hear some of these being sung. We hope that the texts, which we are intended to worship with at each Mass, will bring you much peace and joy, and give you new insights into the readings for each day as well.
