

## PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



*"Come Holy Spirit."* The prayer of Pope Francis calls for a synod on Synodality for Holy Mother Church through 2023. The term "synodality," which comes from two Greek words meaning "*common road*," is for Pope Francis a process of consultations between clerics and lay people that leads to a consensus. This synod will be a dialog as well as listening to voices, concerns, and ideas of the faithful throughout the world. Highlighting the themes of "unity, communion, and fraternity," the pontiff declared that the synod has three key words: communion, participation, and mission. Over the coming months, parishes, schools, and other communities will begin to host listening sessions that will culminate in a diocesan synthesis that will be sent to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Surrounded in prayer and guided by the Holy Spirit, let us pray for the unity Christ prayed, "*That they be one!*"

This past week, I took a couple days and went back to the home farm to help my brother Andy bring in the crops. As he ran the combine, I moved the corn to the grain elevators and strived to keep the combine running. For those who know me, you know that my other life is farming, and I know that's what I would be doing if not wearing this collar. The sun was out, the weather was warm, and the crops are AWESOME! SO much of my time spent on the tractor was spent thinking of St. Francis' *The Canticle of the Sun*, in which he sings praises for all of creation. It's very easy to feel close to God when you're bringing in the harvest. The canticle reads: *Most high, all powerful, all good Lord! All praise is Yours, all glory, all honor, and all blessing. Be praised my Lord through Brother Sun... Be praised through Sister Moon... Praise and bless my Lord, and give thanks and serve Him with great humility!*

Several weeks ago, the Bishop held several meetings throughout the diocese, including one here at SJV, disclosing their findings of a study pertaining to a Diocesan Capital Campaign that would focus largely on support for both retired priests and seminarians. Bishop Zinkula would like to announce that, "In light of the results and in light of our need to act – to build up our church and address the challenges we face – we have decided to move forward with a campaign. It will be a two-year process, with the final parish campaigns occurring in 2023. Please watch for more information in the months ahead and pray for the campaign's success!

As we continue midway through this most beautiful month of October, I hope you're all able to take in and enjoy the colors of fall and beauty of the landscapes. Yes, God is good. Have a good week.



## Homily

### Profession of Faith—Nicene Creed

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.






