

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Monday, November 1, is **All Saints Day**, a special day on our liturgical calendar! This is a day in which we honor the martyrs and saints that have gone before us. The saints are the pillars of our faith and we do well to honor them for showing us the way to sainthood and being true disciples. We also honor them for putting their trust in Christ and living such heroic lives of faith. St. Paul asks us to serve and honor such noble souls. In his epistles, he advises Christians to welcome, serve, and honor those who have put their trust in Jesus –

hence, may we follow their examples! They are also our heavenly mediators, who intercede for us before Christ, therefore are awesome treasures of our faith. And finally, the saints are instruments that God uses to work miracles for us in our own time. Several reasons to make this day holy and spend worthwhile time in honoring these special people.

The following day, November 2, is **All Souls Day**, another day set apart that we may remember and pray for those who have gone before us and are currently in the state of ongoing purification. Our church has a beautiful teaching on Purgatory as a place or state of purification. Here, we believe, souls that are in such states of purification can be helped by the prayers of the faithful. Some modern theologians suggest that the fire of Purgatory is an intense, transforming encounter with Jesus Christ and his fire of love. They also speak of Purgatory as an “instant” purification immediately after death, varying in intensity from soul to soul, depending on the state of the individual.

These two days, All Saints and All Souls, are awesome parts of our faith that give us a great deal of hope that, in our own lives after death, Christ awaits us in our eternal reward to join the “communion of saints” at that heavenly banquet table. It’s during this autumn season that we think more of our own mortality and eternity. As we venerate all those who have gone before us, let us try as hard as we may to live lives worthy of our own sainthood and look forward to our rewards – the reward of living a good, holy and saintly life! And that’s part of the awesomity (my favorite word) of being and living a Catholic life! Amen?!

Speaking of the fall season, this Saturday night is the night we all turn our clocks back one hour – giving everyone plenty of time to make it for Mass on Sunday morning, totally refreshed by that extra hour of sleep! Something we all can look forward to. As my mother always told us: “make good use of that extra hour!”

Tis the season of pumpkins and pumpkin carving. I’ve heard a beautiful correlation between carving pumpkins and the Christian life. It goes like this:

A lady, after recently being baptized, was asked by a co-worker what it was like to be a Christian. She replied, "It's like being a pumpkin: God picks you from the patch, brings you in, and washes off all the dirt that you may have gotten from the other pumpkins. Then he cuts off the top and scoops out all the yucky stuff. He removes the seeds of doubt, hate, greed, etc. Then He carves you a new smiling face and puts His light inside of you to shine for all the world to see."

What a great image for us this week: letting our light shine! I hope you all have a wonderful week!




REMEMBERING OUR FAITHFUL DEPARTED

As we remember our departed loved ones, we engage in an act of healing as we bring our loved ones close to us through our memory. By *re-remembering* them, they are somehow very much alive to us. **We believe that our loved ones, united to Jesus, Mary, Joseph, and all the saints in heaven, are with us in a special way every time we gather for Eucharist.** The priest calls on the whole communion of saints to be with us at the Eucharistic table as bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus.




