

DEACON'S DIALOUGE



Are you one of those people, who, when reading a book, skips ahead to see how it will end? While I have always liked to read and need to get back to doing it daily, I have never found the need to skip to the end. I am afraid that, if I do, I won't want to read the rest of the book. I may miss out on a very enjoyable experience—an experience where I forego the opportunity to gain knowledge or more importantly, wisdom.

I know this to be true because, with our busy schedules, my wife and I will DVR a sporting event we are interested in watching later. But, I end up looking at the real time scoring alerts on my phone nearly every time. If the results are not to my liking, I will skip watching the recorded game. Time saver, right? Except, if the game goes my way, something is lost for me in knowing the end.

This weekend, the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, we recognize that we are fast approaching the end of our liturgical year. In fact, next weekend, the Solemnity of Christ the King ends the year in which we have listened primarily to the Gospel of Mark. Have you noticed that the tone of the readings has changed? Particularly this week, we hear in Daniel of “a time unsurpassed in distress,” while Jesus speaks of how “the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light.” For me, these readings sound scary, yet hopeful.

Why scary? Because they tell of the end of all things we know to exist, the world as we know it. And while I do not believe the end times are near, I simply believe as Jesus reminds us: “no one knows ... but only the Father.” I do think these images that we see in today's readings are necessary. I think too that sometimes it takes some powerful and frightening words and imagery to shake us up to the point we determine to make necessary changes in our daily lives. And while we may not live to see the end times, we do need to be reminded that our own lives have limits. Perhaps we need to consider where and how we are spending our time and efforts.

But, we can't stop with just these thoughts. These readings also bring us hope! They are hopeful because we hear the promise that evil will not win. Hopeful because we hear that “where there is forgiveness of these (sin), there is no longer offering for sin.” Christ was the one and only necessary offering for us! His love for us compelled Him to be that offering.

As our new liturgical year begins in two weeks with the Season of Hope—Advent—we do well to remember that we have hope in knowing that whenever and however the end comes, it is in God's merciful hands. We have hope knowing that in all the bad, all the evil, all the chaos, and all the heartache that we see, our world was created lovingly by a loving parent. We have hope knowing that Christ's goodness, His mercy, His forgiveness, and His love will overcome all evil, all brutality, all violence. And if you truly pay attention to Jesus' Gospel preaching this weekend, you will see that He is inviting us to share His hope! He is calling us to go out into the world and face the fear, to share the suffering, to denounce the evil – that is, to actively work to bring the hope of the Gospel to all. What plans can we put in place to make this happen?

Keeping Christ in Christmas

EXERPTS FROM ADVENT 2020:

Our Advent Wreath: My dad made one out of some scrap wood, in the form of a T, with candle holders made from bottle caps, inverted and nailed to the four corners. My sisters decorated it with three purple candles and one pink candle. We lit for dinner each night in Advent, hoping that they would last all four weeks.

Christmas in Kabul: As an Army officer, I spent the Advent season and Christmas of 2003 in Kabul, Afghanistan. With imminent danger and destitution surrounding us as part of our daily external environment, it was difficult to meditate on the Advent virtues of hope, love, joy, and peace. However, within the micro environment of our base camp, there was the opportunity to realize real examples of each virtue. **Hope** that we were making a difference by serving in this place. **Love** for my brothers in arms who I trusted my life to and their lives to me: *Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.* **Joy** in celebrating mass with fellow Catholics, hidden away in small groups in austere rooms, and feeling a connection to the early Christians. **Peace** in relinquishing fear of physical harm by fearing God: *do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.*

Straw: Advent has always filled my heart with hope and expectation. As a child, for each good deed we did, or each chore we finished, my parents would reward us with a strand of straw. We would place the straw in the small box we had that served as our manger. The idea was to have enough straw to make a comfortable bed for Jesus, who showed up in the manger on Christmas morning.
