Scripture Reflection

It is clear from the Gospel that the apostles still didn't understand what Jesus' mission was all about. They were still thinking of Jesus' mission in terms of power and authority. They desired to share in the power and authority. Jesus then attempts to teach them the true meaning of discipleship. Jesus says, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the servant of all."

We are called to share in the mission of Jesus. Living in union with the Lord doesn't guarantee a life free from suffering. The apostles began to understand this, and so must we. Following Jesus' example of service will help us understand Jesus' mission.

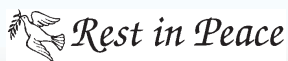

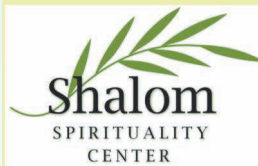
Fall Family Activity Nights at Holy Family Catholic Schools
