

Casa

The Child Advocacy Board maintains both the Foster Care Review Board and Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) programs. They are in need of volunteers. A CASA is a trained community volunteer who acts as the eyes and ears of the judge in a juvenile court case when a family is involved due to abuse and/or neglect. The CASA gathers necessary information regarding a child's strengths, needs and services and reports to the judge so that the judge is well-informed when making decisions regarding the health and safety of a child.
